2. The East Hall Market will be completing this summer along with the residence hall project and will be opening in the fall. This will be a self-check-out market available for all students 24/7.
 3. A new market will be installed in the north/campus-side section of the Campus Store in the Memorial Union. This will be very similar to the East Hall Market with self-check-out technology and open 24/7 to those with tap access to the Memorial Union (which all students have).

1. Line painting in parking lots will occur in May, June, and July. Transportation Services will communicate which lots are unavailable while this work occurs.
 2. A new parking lot on Woodland across from the Delta Sigma Tau fraternity will be created. The new lot will have 24 spaces which will be 24 hour metered parking through park mobile.
 3. Shuttle service will move to summer schedule on 4/28. Tuesday through Saturday from 10am to 6pm.

1. Be's refreshments has (finally) secured and tested the technology to accept the Husky Card at campus vending machines. Installation of the card readers is scheduled to begin during finals week.
- I. Athletics & Recreation (SDC):**
1. SDC is closed starting Saturday, April 26th until May 4th - annual steam shutdown, cleaning and floor resurfacing. Floor/Court resurfacing will last until Sunday, May 11th. Gates Tennis Center will remain open only closing on Saturday, April 26th.
 2. Summer building schedule starts Monday, May 5th - www.michigantechrecreation.com for details.
 3. Onboarding new recreation software starting May 5th and rolling out in phases over the summer. Software will include modules for facilities reservations, fitness classes, events, locker memberships, etc...
- J. Library-** The Provost's Office is currently exploring a project to place a Testing Center on the third floor of the Van Pelt and Opie Library. This would take up approximately a quarter of the open seating on the east side of the floor, and the remainder of the space would remain dedicated silent study space. This Testing Center would replace the one previously located in Rekhi Hall, which must be relocated over the summer.
