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Johnston County Public School K-5 Grading Guidelines

3rd Quarter Progress and Report Cards

Student progress will reflect what was earned as of March 13th for the 3rd quarter.

Teachers have reviewed student work samples, performance, and assessments as of March 13 to determine student progress and mastery for the 3rd quarter. PowerSchool will be updated by April 21st to reflect this progress. Additional updates may occur based on guidance received from the North Carolina State Board of Education.

- If the student's performance on a priority standard as of March 13th reflected a P or M, the student will be deemed as proficient on those standards up until the 3rd quarter.
- If the student's performance on a priority standard as of March 13th reflected a N or a B, the student was not progressing on those standards as of the end of the 3rd quarter. The teacher will work with the student to determine an appropriate plan of action to support growth in key priority learning areas.

Teachers will continue to monitor progress toward these essential skills and give feedback accordingly.

Report cards will not be mailed at this time. Parents may visit the JCPS parent portal to view student progress. Parents should reach out to their child's teacher (by email, or school phone/voicemail) if they would like to talk about their student's progress.

Students with IEPs also require progress reports; they will be emailed to parents between April 21-24.

4th Quarter Progress and Final Report Card

As previously stated, Johnston County Public Schools will not engage in grading and reporting in the format typically used by our district because we cannot guarantee for all students that we are meeting all the critical factors for effective remote learning. Instead, during the final quarter our teachers will provide meaningful feedback to students on skill attainment to promote student growth. Students should continue to put forth their best efforts to engage in the learning opportunities and the content.

We are awaiting guidance from the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction regarding how final reporting will occur for K-5.
