Selected projects done by participants

1. Using and evaluating different calibration training tools

- a. Resources
 - i. Metaculus
 - ii. Openphil
- b. Review
 - i. Over the past two weeks, I embarked on a self-calibration project to refine my estimation skills, inspired by Julia Galef's "Scout Mindset" and Douglas W. Hobbart's "How to Measure Anything". This exercise seeks to overcome overconfidence or under confidence in estimation through training, with the aim of one's confidence level mirroring their accuracy. Estimations involve probability assignments, which can be honed through platforms like Metaculus and Openphil. These platforms provide a variety of formats for practicing estimation, requiring a modest 30-minute



commitment per session. I believe this project has potential, and I recommend others to engage in such calibration exercises.

2. Reflecting on Ratings Directory for Companies

- a. EA Forum Post
- b. Review
 - i. Recognizing the lack of a comprehensive resource for job seekers interested in Effective Altruism-aligned roles, I propose the creation of a directory. This tool, akin to a socially responsible version of Glassdoor, would provide insight into companies' societal impact and hold them accountable. Following a review of resources such as wiki forum EA-related orgs, GiveWell, and Good On You, I metrics such recommend considering as transparency, cost-effectiveness, alignment with EA's pressing causes, EA-driven recommendations, environmental impact, philanthropic contributions, and ethical leadership. However, I'm left with two questions: 1) Is this tool potentially useful? 2) What resources can provide data for these metrics?

- 5. Founding a new EA local group
- 6. Planning a discussion round about animal welfare

- Standard: Germany-wide synchronous start with events such as sizable giving games, 1on1 mentorship, impact challenges, book scholarship, extension to 8 weeks with own projects, etc.

They need to keep in touch with the Intro Program organizers to get support and ensure quality standards. For that purpose, we will publish specific templates.
