Matt invites board members to come see training in action. ● Budget Updates (end of current year and next year’s projection): Fiscal year is looking pretty good; Matt is running final numbers now. ● Summer Events: Will be setting up Extern visits; board members invited to join us on any of those. 	<p>STEM Central Operations Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Summer Teacher Externships: Ann Gritzner reports we have placed 72 Externs across the state, 20 of which are in our region. <p>Two asks from Ann: Abundance of teachers in Iowa City and Cedar Rapids, and we need hosts. Six teachers in the CR/IC area need placements at this time. Repeat hosts are set up, in addition to a few new sites in and around Cedar Rapids and Iowa City. Also, an Extern who was placed at Bayer had to back out, so we are looking for a teacher to fill that placement. Ann is looking for contacts in the region. Matt mentions BioNeos as a possible host site to check in with. Matt also mentions the Office of the State Archeologist as a possible host site. Dan mentions Innovative Software Engineering as a place to reach out to; site has previously expressed interest in having Externs.</p> <p>Onboarding meetings are under way.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Other news from Ann: STEM BEST is wrapping up the season and gearing up for STEMposium, which is in Boone in June. STEM BEST is having the Explore program this summer as well. The Youth Advisory Board is accepting applications through 5:00 p.m. today; looking to get these members more involved moving forward. <p>STEM Day at the Fair is August 17; big footprint on main concourse, as in years past. Matt adds that there is also a main-stage act and other activities. Currently inviting exhibitors; ideas welcome. Dan asks which kinds of exhibitors are sought; Ann mentions it is sort of a mini STEM festival, so hands-on, engaging activities are welcome. Also always looking for volunteers if anyone is interested in joining that day. Network team will be working on procedural aspects of this over the summer. Matt has a few people who have shown interest. Matt mentions wanting to expand the team and introduce some in-person meetings; invites members to offer ideas for where we might do these meetings/visits. Matt adds that conversations are underway with other regions to do some networking among the regional boards. Matt anticipates the first meeting for 2025-2026 to be in August. <p>Trina asks whether different representation among members will remain a goal; Matt says yes, though some consolidation of those categories might occur. Matt adds that getting some community members and/or retired members onto the board.
