- Is this frequency in use? <YOUR CALLSIGN>
- Calling the Surrey Emergency Program Amateur Radio Net. <TWICE>
- This is <YOUR CALLSIGN—USE PHONETICS>. My name is <YOUR NAME>, and I am located in <YOUR SURREY DISTRICT>. I am assuming the duties of the net control station and for the duration of the net I will use the SEPAR call sign VE7HME.
- This net meets every Tuesday at 1930 local time on SEPAR channel 1 the VE7RSC North repeater at 147.360 + 600 kHz and a tone of 110.9.
- The purposes of the weekly net are to provide information related to the operation of SEPAR, and to practice
 effective emergency communication. This is a directed net and all check-ins and traffic are under the direction of
 the Net Control Station. Please note that general announcements or info related to club events should be saved
 for the SARC meeting at 2000hrs
- Are there any stations with emergency or priority traffic?
- Stations with emergency or priority traffic may break in at any time.
- During an emergency or disaster all SEPAR members are asked to check-in to this repeater SEPAR Channel 1 and provide a status report. If this repeater fails to respond, please monitor SEPAR Channel 5 at 146.550 simplex for further instructions.
- After station check-ins, additional instructions may be provided. We request that stations monitor this net and provide updates as they become available. If your availability status changes, please inform net control promptly.
- We will now begin taking check-ins. When your district is called, please give your callsign in phonetics and wait to be acknowledged by net control. We encourage stations to use the optional SEPAR Net Protocol to provide their status update as concisely as possible.
- We will take check-ins in the following order: SEPAR Coordinator, or stations on a task, Stations with any non-routine traffic, City Centre/Whalley, Cloverdale, Fleetwood, Guildford, Newton, South Surrey, Echolink, All other Stations
- We now take check-ins from <DISTRICT> <WAIT FOR TRAFFIC REPEAT UNTIL ALL DISTRICTS DONE>
- Any late or missed check-ins from any area? <WAIT FOR TRAFFIC>

SIMPLEX CALLS (FOR WEEKLY NET)

- If this were an actual emergency or disaster, additional instructions would be provided at this time.
- We will now proceed with a Roll-call check-in on Simplex. If you wish to participate in the simplex check-in please monitor <SELECTED VHF or UHF FREQUENCY> simplex and respond when called or to relay a response. Net control will call all stations from the repeater check in list in order. Stations are asked to respond with a signal report (eg 5/9 or plain language)
- Please do not call in the blind if you cannot hear net control, wait until sweeps are conducted at the end of the
 roll. We will resume this repeater net at 1950hrs local.
- This is <YOUR CALLSIGN> as Net control switching now to <SELECTED VHF or UHF FREQUENCY> simplex

MOVE TO SIMPLEX FREQUENCY

- This is VE7HME for the SEPAR weekly net is this frequency in use? <WAIT FOR TRAFFIC>
- I will now call all stations from the repeater check-in list. <CALL STATIONS>
- Are there any unacknowledged stations, or any other stations that wish to check in to the SEPAR net.
 <WAIT FOR TRAFFIC>
- CALL FOR SWEEPS FROM 2 STATIONS IN DIFFERENT AREAS
- We are now returning to SEPAR Channel 1 (VE7RSC N) (SWEEPS TO ALSO ADVISE STATIONS WE ARE RETURNING TO REPEATER.) (SWITCH FREQUENCY)

CLOSING

- This is VE7HME resuming the SEPAR net at 1950local. From a roll-call of <# OF STATIONS ON RPTR
 CHECKIN) we had (# OF STATIONS ON SIMPLEX) direct and (# RELAYED) relay responses. Thank you to all
 that were able to participate.
