29.2 Ezekiel 37

Use in conjunction with the Student Manual

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Read Ezekiel 37:1–2, looking for what Ezekiel saw in a vision. What did Ezekiel see in the middle of the valley?
What questions would you have if you were in the midst of the valley of dry bones?
Read Ezekiel 37:3, looking for what the Lord asked Ezekiel.
Read Ezekiel 37:4–6, looking for the Lord's response to the question He asked.
What did the Lord say He would do with the bones?
Read Ezekiel 37:7–10, and notice what happened to the bones Ezekiel saw.
1. Can these bones live? Answer this question by writing your testimony of Jesus Christ and His power to resurrect us.
Read Ezekiel 37:15–17, looking for the two sticks that would bless many lives forever.
What do you think it means that these two sticks or books of scripture "shall become one in thine hand" (Ezekiel 37:17)?
Read 1 Nephi 13:40, looking for what the Book of Mormon (described in this verse as part of the "last records") and the Bible (described as the "first [records]") together would make known among all people.
2. Why do you think it is important to have more than one book of scripture that testifies of Jesus Christ?
3. How has studying both the Bible and the Book of Mormon helped you to feel prepared to proclaim and defend your testimony of Jesus Christ?
 4. To help you memorize Ezekiel 37:15–17, write the first letter of each word in verses 15–17. Use the letters you wrote to help you recite the passage aloud. Refer to the verses as needed.
