Spanish 2A

Course Description:

Spanish 2A

Full Year (Meets daily)

This course is a continuation of Spanish studied in the 6th grade Spanish 1A course, and moves at a faster pace than the Spanish 2C on-level course. The course focuses on the four language domains: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Core instruction is delivered daily in the target language, providing students with the opportunity to communicate about meaningful content in the context of vertically-aligned thematic units. Students are encouraged and expected to use the target language throughout daily lessons in order to build their oral and written linguistic proficiency in a cultural context, as they expand their prior knowledge of vocabulary and grammar concepts acquired in 6th grade.

Aligned to the World-Readiness Standards for Learning Languages and the ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines, this course will build on students' foundational language skills in the four language domains in order to develop their communicative confidence in a world language as they continue to pursue language study through middle school.

By the end of this course, students will be able to describe their routines, activities they like to do for fun, household items and chores associated with a house, identify how and where a variety of sports are played, and discuss when events occur, talk about past vacations, and how to stay healthy and lead a healthy lifestyle.
