- If you'd like to take one of the three aliyot... the readings for this Shabbat are noted on the following pages... please note your Hebrew name AND whether you'd like to read from the scroll, a chumash, or a tikkun OR have a member of the congregation read from the Torah scroll for you.

Regardless of whether you'd like to read from the Torah or have someone do it for you, we ask you to prepare a short, several-minute drash (no more than five minutes, please) about your reading.

- Children of all ages are welcome! We have plush Torahs little ones can parade around, and the service offers opportunities for older kids to lead parts of the service, i.e.. Ashrei, Anim Z'meirot, or other prayers.
- We have minimal copies of the siddur, so we urge you to please buy, borrow, or otherwise bring your own copy of the Lev Shalem Siddur. Siddurim can be purchased at the [Rabbinic Assembly book store](#) or on [Amazon](#).
