"HOW TO GET TO THE TOP?"

Objectives:

- to revise active vocabulary on the topic;
- to develop reading skills (scan reading, skim reading);
- to revise grammar material (word-formation);
- to develop communicative competence;
- to develop social competence;

Equipment:

Posters, tape recordings, hand out materials, a CD player or a tape recorder.

Procedure:

1. The lesson opening.

Dear friends! At our today's lesson we shall discuss the problem of fame and its influence on people's lives. In the course of our lesson we are to make a kind of project which I called "The Tree of Fame". We shall grow this tree from the roots to the leaves trying to understand how to rise to the top. You will present your projects and they will help us to find out the roots of fame. Doing exercises we shall discover the conditions necessary to become famous. And now though it may seem unnatural we'll start with leaves.

2. Warming up.

(There is a poster with the tree of fame on the board and students suggest different celebrities as "leaves" saying a few words about them. The names are written on leaf-shape sheets of paper of green colour and the teacher sticks them to the tree.)

- T.: I'd like you to think over any famous person from any time or country and suggest your "leaf" for our tree.
- S1 Famous American actor Tatum O'Neal won an Oscar aged 10.
- S2 World-known swimmer Steve Redgrave has won 5 gold medals.
- S3 Great conductor George Solti had 31 Grammies by the time he died in 1937, etc.

3. Main Part.

Our tree has put on a bright amazing dress of coloured leaves. But it was impossible for it to grow without rains and the sun, without care and love of the gardener. Now our task is to find out all the vital conditions and characteristic features for our tree to become strong and beautiful. The exercises we are going to do will help us to cope with this task.

(Students read the texts and do the tasks.)

- T.: Let's sum up what is necessary for a person if he wants to succeed in life.
- S1: Family support is very important.
- S2: It is impossible to become famous without determination.
- S3: To achieve popularity you should be very hard-working like Richard Prescott.
- S4: If you want to rise to the top you shouldn't be afraid of being ambitious.
- S5: If you want to succeed in life you must be disciplined.

(The teacher sticks the cards with words "determination", "discipline", 'hard work", "ambition", "family support" to the poster.)

4. Project presentation.

T: It's high time for us to look at the roots of fame. You will present your projects and tell us what should be done to become famous and world known.

(Students present their projects.)

One of the projects can be devoted to any famous people who achieved popularity due to their natural talent and abilities. They may dramatize the fable "The Quartet" by I.Krylov.

One of the projects may be devoted to the people who gained their fame because they did something unusual. For example the students present the poster and the poem "A Wedding Cake" and their own translation.

One of the projects may be devoted to the people who were born famous, for example the members of the royal family.

T: You have presented your projects and we can come to the conclusion about the roots of fame. If you want to become famous you must be born famous, do something unusual or just be talented.

5. Summing up.

T: To sum up everything we have spoken about today I suggest finishing a kind of instruction "**How to Rise to the Top**".

(Students complete the gaps with an adjective form of the nouns in brackets)

When Fame Hits the Family

When 14-year-old **Steven Spielberg** cut his cinematic teeth in his first war movie, it was Mum, according to Steven, who crawled through enemy fire in a soldier's uniform before making lunch and dad who squeezed into his old air force uniform and worked out exactly how much flour was needed for a convincing explosion.

The mother of **Jana Novotna**, a Wimbledon tennis champion, tells that the family went without holidays and spare cash for ten years so that they could pay for Jana's equipment and coaching. Nowadays Jana is one of the top-ranked women players in the world and has earned over \$9 million in prize money.

Film star **Leonardo DiCaprio** lived with his mother, Irmelin, for many years in Los Angeles. Irmelin separated amicably from his father, comic-book artist George, when Leo was a baby. She cheerfully put up with Leo's poor record at school and wild teenage ways until Leo made a commercial aged 14 and swiftly

became a successful teenage actor. Friends say that Leo's relationship with both parents is so good it can't be real. His mother handles his business affairs and his father helps him to choose scripts. "My mother is cool", Leo says. "She doesn't care about this whole thing, fame. She cares about me."

Parents of England striker **Michael Owen** have four other children but they are unashamedly proud of their World Cup son, and so they should be. Mum has kept a scrapbook ever since he was a small boy; she wept when he was voted BBC Sports Personality of the Year. Dad, a former professional footballer and now an insurance salesman, still hopes that Michael might do well both on and off the field.
