

ATTENDANCE

Absences

If your child is absent please call the front office at (208) 854-5480 before 9:30 AM on the morning of the absence. You can leave a message if you are unable to get through. You may also email lowellattendance@boiseschools.org.

If you know in advance that your child will miss school, please inform the office and your child's teacher as early as possible. With adequate prior notice the teacher can prepare (if possible) make-up assignments for the time missed. Additionally, please provide doctor's notes if your child is absent due to an appointment so those can be excused.

Tardies

Students are tardy when they are not in their classroom when the bell rings at 9:15 AM. **Your child must report to the office first to obtain a pass if he or she is tardy before going to class.** Students arriving after 10:30 AM are recorded as a half day absence. Tardies which are caused by a late bus, either District or city bus, shall not be counted on the student's record. The principal or designee may also excuse student tardiness because of inclement weather or other extenuating circumstances.

Health and Illness

The nurse's office is for sick children and emergencies only. If your child is ill, please keep her/him home and contact the school.

You will be notified and your child will likely be sent home if there is:

- A fever greater than 100 degrees
- Vomiting and diarrhea
- Other problems deemed a health concern by the school nurse or principal.

If your child is too ill to be outside, please keep him/her home. Children at school are expected to be able to go outside (weather permitting). In order to provide adequate supervision, we cannot have some students stay in and others go outside during recess.

Please refer to the [Boise School District Illness Procedure](#). This document provides important screening guidance and information about illness. Please call the nurse with any questions or for support.

Students needing medication while at school must have a statement of permission signed by the parent/guardian and on file in the health office. A prescription bottle with the student's name and dosage is required. For over the counter medication, the original bottle must be provided.

Important Notice to Parents Concerning Student Injuries

Even with the greatest precautions and the closest supervision, accidents can and do happen at school. The District does not provide insurance coverage for student accidents. If your child is not covered by your Homeowner's Policy, or other medical insurance, you may purchase the insurance offered by the District's approved company. Applications are available in the office.

CONTACT INFORMATION AND VISITORS

Change of Information and Emergencies

It is **very important** that any changes of address, telephone number, parent's place of employment, emergency number, sitter/daycare be reported to the school office immediately. Too often, emergencies arise and we are unable to contact the parent or someone at the emergency number. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Visitors

All visitors must check in at the office. The Boise School District uses a visitor management system called Raptor to strengthen campus safety for students and faculty. Visitors will be asked to present a Driver's License in order to be issued a visitor's badge. A visitor's badge will not be necessary for those who visit our schools simply to drop off an item in the office or pick up paperwork.

We appreciate your cooperation with our procedures and the effort you make to check in at the office when visiting the school.

COMMUNICATION

We encourage parents to call or email teachers with questions. Every staff member at Lowell Elementary can be reached through email by using the following format:

Messages

Parents should communicate any instructions for the day before school. Students are not allowed to call home to arrange after school plans with friends. Messages can be left for teachers by calling 854-5480; however, delivering these messages can be disruptive to the student and classroom. We know that emergencies arise, but ask that as often as possible, after school plans are determined before your child arrives at school. Thanks for your support.

Cell Phones/Smart Watches

Students are expected to keep cell phones **turned off when on school property and kept in students' backpacks or designated device locations in the classroom** and smart watches turned on do not disturb mode. This includes recess, lunch, and on the playground. Misuse of cell phones or smart watches may result in the phone or smart watch being turned into the office to be picked up at the end of the day. **In the event of an emergency, students will use school phones.** Please see Boise School District Policy #3241: **A principal may choose to ban electronic communication devices in the event of misuse.**

Emergency Phone Calls

The building phones are business phones and students may use them for emergencies only with permission from the administrative staff or their teacher.

Infinite Campus

This is a web-based program that allows students and parents/guardians to view student grades and attendance records. For more information on how to get started, please contact the office. Dress Code

Boise School District Policy #3223

The Boise School District recognizes that the primary responsibility for a student's attire resides with the student and their parent(s) or guardian(s).

The school district is responsible for seeing that student attire does not interfere with the health or safety of any student, that student attire does not contribute to a hostile or intimidating atmosphere for any student, and that dress code enforcement does not reinforce or increase marginalization or oppression of any group based on race, sex, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, household income, or body type/size.

The Boise School District Dress Code Policy prioritizes in-class learning time, student dignity, and positive relationships within the school community. We believe the policy and procedures should be clear and specific so that they are easy to understand and can be applied uniformly and consistently.

Students Must Wear:

- Shirt or Top: with non see-through fabric in the front, back, and on the sides under the arms
- Bottoms: pants, lounge pants, sweatpants, shorts, boardshorts, skirt, dress, leggings,
- Shoes are required
- Some courses may require assignment and/or safety-specific dress (closed-toed shoes, for example).

Students Cannot Wear:

- Swimsuits
- Visible underwear. However, visible waistbands or straps on undergarments worn under other clothing are not a violation of the policy.
- Violent language or images
- Images or overt language depicting drugs, alcohol or any illegal item or activity
- Hate speech, profanity, pornography
- See policy 3234 for dress restrictions related to gang activity

Standardized training and procedures will be developed through an ongoing process to support the policy.

Students are also expected to dress appropriately for the weather.

Parents and visitors in the building are asked to follow the dress code while at school.

Lost and Found

- Be sure to mark jackets, backpacks, lunch boxes, hats, and gloves with your child's name, so they can be returned if they are lost. Lost and found items are located in the basement outside the lunchroom. Be sure to check there if your child is missing anything.

Note: Lost and Found will be purged the last day before students go on vacation for the following breaks (Thanksgiving, Winter, Spring, and Summer). Items not identified will be donated.

FOOD SERVICE

Breakfast and Lunch

Boise Schools provide a breakfast and lunch program, which is available to all students.

This school year, all children in the Boise School District will receive free breakfast. Additionally, our school is now participating in the USDA Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), qualifying for free meals, including lunch, for the next four years.

Key Points:

- **No Applications Needed:** You don't need to complete an application for free or reduced-priced meals for students at our school.
- **Other Schools:** If you have students at other Boise School District schools that are not CEP, applications may still be necessary for those students to receive free or reduced-priced lunch benefits.
- **Complete Meals Only:** The free meal benefit applies only to complete student meals. Additional items like milk or a second entrée require money on the student's meal account or cash payment.

FIELD TRIPS

Permission Slip

Students need written permission to attend field trips during the year. **A general consent form that will cover all field trips scheduled throughout the year will be sent home at the beginning of the year.**

GRADES

The Boise School District promotes [sound grading practices](#). Policies can be found on the District's website. Parent-teacher conferences are held only at the end of the first grading period. We strongly encourage parents to attend the parent-teacher conferences scheduled for your child/ren.

Additionally, the Boise School District uses a program called Infinite Campus (IC) that allows all parents access to student grades, attendance, and class assignments. If you have an account you can reach the [Infinite Campus Portal](#) through the District's website. Please contact the office to get started if you do not already have an account.

LIBRARY

All students have access to the Lowell library. The librarian will explain book checkout procedures to students during their first visit. Students are expected to respect library materials and treat them with appropriate care. Students will be responsible for any library materials lost or damaged while under their use or care.

MUSIC

In addition to vocal music classes, beginning string and band instrument classes are offered for fifth and sixth grades. Any interested fourth, fifth, and sixth grader may participate in choir.

PARTIES/BIRTHDAYS

Class parties and birthday celebrations will be organized by classroom teachers. Please check with your classroom teacher before sending birthday treats.

If you choose to send birthday treats, please send those with an ingredient label due to food allergies and student safety.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT

Volunteers

Parental support is an integral part of the educational process. We welcome and encourage volunteers. Please contact your child's teacher about volunteer opportunities in the classroom.

PTSA

Lowell has an outstanding **P**arent **T**eacher **S**tudent **A**ssociation which meets monthly. The meeting schedule will be posted on the internet and reminders will be sent home. We strongly encourage your participation. It is a terrific way to get involved in your child's education. Everyone is encouraged to attend. Although everyone is encouraged to join, you **do not** need to be a member to attend the meetings. You can follow more PTSA news on [Instagram](#) or [Facebook](#).

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Students are discouraged from bringing personal belongings (toys, radios, gaming devices, music devices/players, trading cards, cameras) or large sums of money to school. These items often cause a distraction to the educational process and will be sent home. The school is not responsible for personal belongings or money that becomes lost, broken, or stolen. Cameras are not allowed to be taken out to recess, as photos taken may be unwanted and may not be approved by all students' parents/guardians.

POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL SUPPORTS (PBIS)

At Lowell Elementary School, we embrace PBIS. PBIS is a schoolwide system that values an atmosphere of safety and shared responsibility. We choose to celebrate student and staff successes while creating an environment where every interaction is a potential learning opportunity. Emphasis is placed on teaching and reinforcing important social skills using common language and values (PRIDE) throughout the school. All of which will support the district values of Respect, Responsibility, Honesty, Dignity, and Teamwork.

Students will be supported in learning and practicing the behaviors outlined in the Lowell Character PRIDE Matrix (see next page). Students are expected to follow the behavior guidelines while at school. Failure to follow the behavior expectations in the matrix may result in student discipline.

Lowell Pride Celebrations

Every other month a teacher will nominate students in their classroom who have consistently demonstrated one of the PRIDE values, as it aligns to Lowell's school wide focus (Lowell's Character Matrix). Students will be recognized and honored for showing their Lowell Pride.

SCHOOL SAFETY & EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

The staff at Lowell Elementary has taken steps to make our school as safe as possible. We have a detailed safety plan should there ever be a crisis and partner with the local police department to ensure our procedures keep students safe.

Emergency Response Plan

Notification of Threat Assessment Process

Please see BSD's Notification of our [Threat Assessment Process](#). This details safety procedures involving safety procedures involving potential threats at Lowell in accordance with [BSD District Policy 3225](#).

Inclement Weather

Dress for Conditions: During *extremely cold or wet weather*, the determination of when children will be brought indoors will be made by the building administrator or designee, so *please have your children dress appropriately for the weather*.

District Weather Guidelines: A guideline of *20 degrees or colder with or without a wind chill* is used in determining whether students stay outside or are brought into the school building. *Air Quality Alerts* for the area are also used in determining whether students stay outside or are brought into the school building. Recess held indoors will be in the student's classroom or gym.

School Cancellation: Cancellation of school takes place *only during circumstances such as extreme weather, equipment failure, or public crisis*. The Board of Trustees and Office of the Superintendent of Schools are aware of the hardship which can be caused by an abrupt cancellation of school. Therefore, school will not be canceled unless a significant safety risk has been created by unusual circumstances. *Every practical means is used to notify parents of a cancellation, including radio, TV, and newspapers*. In addition, messages will be broadcasted through Infinite Campus, Lowell's webpage, as well as a direct email.

In the unusual circumstance school must be canceled during the school day, the school will determine that all students have satisfactory transportation and supervision at their home before releasing them from school.

Threat Assessment Process

Please see the BSD [Student Threat Assessment Parent Notification](#). This process has been developed as part of our commitment to creating and maintaining an educational environment in which the emotional and physical safety of students, staff, parents and others is a priority.

SPORTS

In addition to physical education classes, an after-school athletic program in two sports is offered to students in grades five and six: Girls' Basketball October-December, Boys' Basketball January-March, Boys' and Girls' Track April-May.

TRANSPORTATION, BEFORE AND AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Bicycles/Skateboards/Rollerblades

Bicycles are to be placed in bike racks on the South end of the school. The school cannot be held responsible for lost or stolen bicycles. Bikes should be chained and locked. Students are to walk their bikes, scooters, and skateboards once they arrive on school property. We encourage all students to use the proper safety equipment such as helmets when riding bikes and skateboards. Students are to walk their bicycles, skateboards, or scooters through street crosswalks.

Walking or Riding Bicycles

Please visit with your child about safety precautions while walking or riding a bike to school. An adult crossing guard will assist students crossing at the intersection of State & 28th. Additional student crossing guards will be located on the corners of Heron and 28th as well as Hazel and 28th. *Please urge your children to respect and cooperate with crossing guards.*

Bus Loading Zone

The bus loading zone is located on W. Lemp Street. Parents please do not park or drop your student off on W. Lemp Street, as this is the school bus drop off zone. Please park in designated parking areas noted on the Boise School District "Lowell Elementary Traffic Flow Map."

Bus Riders are expected to ride the bus each day unless we have written permission with instructions from the student's parent and/or guardian as to an alternative plan. Without a note from a parent/guardian, students will follow their usual routine of riding the bus home.

Extra Curricular Events Held on Campus

For safety precautions, students must be accompanied by an adult to participate or observe extracurricular events held at the school.

Leaving School During the Day

When leaving during the school day, a student must be signed out of the front office by a parent/guardian or parent designee. Students are not allowed to leave school early with someone not listed on their enrollment form unless the school has written permission, signed by a parent/guardian or received a phone call from the parent/guardian.

Just For Kids (JFK)

Students enrolled in JFK will be dropped off and picked up at the JFK portable.

The Just For Kids program is a District sanctioned before and after school child care program. Child care is provided Monday - Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Enrollment is limited. For additional information, please call 854-5482.

Parent Transportation

Please drop students off in front of the main entrance on 28th. For safety reasons, please do not drop your child off in the parking lot at the North end of the building.

Students are to go directly to the playground unless they have a scheduled appointment with staff in the building prior to the start of the school day.

Students should NOT arrive at school prior to 8:45 am. and must be off school grounds no later than 15 minutes after the dismissal bell (K-6th @ 3:45 pm.), as playground supervisors are not available until 8:45 am or after 4:00 p.m.

Parking

Please refer to the “Lowell Elementary Traffic Flow Map” for designated areas to park. Students are asked to use the sidewalk near the bike racks to safely head to the playground. If your child does need to cross 28th street, please have them use the crosswalk. A crossing guard will assist students crossing 28th.

VIRTUAL LEARNING

Students will be provided with a device in class. Devices from home should not be brought to school.

Digital Citizenship

Lowell is dedicated to keeping students safe while online. Whether in person or online, we will teach digital citizenship. Digital citizenship refers to responsible technology usage, and teaching digital citizenship is essential to helping students achieve and understand digital literacy, as well as ensuring cyberbullying prevention, online safety, digital responsibility and digital health and wellness.

BSD District Device Expectations outline and guide the use of technology.

As a Digital Citizen I Will:

- Keep private information private. My password(s) and identity are mine and not to be shared.
- Treat others with respect both online and offline.
- Have appropriate conversations in all my interactions with others.
- Report anyone who tries to use technology tools to hurt or harass me to an appropriate authority (teacher, principal, parent, etc.).
- Strive to be a responsible digital citizen and encourage others to do so, as well.
- Credit my sources when I am using other people's information, images or other material.
- Follow Boise School District policies, rules and regulations.
- Exercise care and personal responsibility when using school/district equipment.

As a Digital Citizen I Understand:

- Internet access is available to further learning goals and objectives.
- Any computer work may be lost and I should be careful to backup important work in more than one location.
- Some things from the Internet I read may not be true.
- Cyber-bullying is a violation of Boise School District policies and if caught doing it I can be subject to disciplinary action.
- I may not create, transmit, or communicate any material accessible via the Internet that contains items that are illegal, obscene, harassing, insulting, ostracizing, or intimidating to others.
- The Boise School District does not condone or permit the viewing or use of inappropriate material and uses content filtering software to protect students and staff to the extent possible.
- Content filtering tools are not completely fail-safe.
 - School and district personnel have the authority and responsibility to monitor appropriate use of technology tools.
 - Parents are also encouraged to monitor their child's Internet activity.
- Using a school computer or network is not private; even when generated on a personal device.
 - Teachers and district staff may review my work and activities when I am using a Boise School District log-on.
 - Any and all Boise School District log-on histories can be inspected.

BULLYING, HAZING AND HARASSMENT POLICY

Boise School District Policy #3231

The board is committed to maintaining an educational environment that protects and promotes dignity, individual worth, and mutual respect for each individual and is free from harassment. Each District student, employee, or visitor deserves the opportunity to participate or work in a safe, supportive atmosphere...free from all forms of discrimination and conduct that can be considered harassing, coercive or disruptive.

STUDENT CONDUCT POLICY

Boise School District Policy #3230

Students on any school premises or at any school sponsored activity, regardless of location, are expected to obey District officials, protect property, maintain order and decorum, avoid excessive physical contact, fighting, and public displays of affection and conduct themselves in a positive manner.

STUDENT SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY

Boise School District Policy #3232

It is the policy of the Boise School District to maintain a learning environment free from sexual harassment. Each student has the right to work in an atmosphere that promotes equal opportunities, free from all forms of discrimination and conduct that can be considered harassing, coercive, or disruptive. Sexual harassment refers to sexual overtures or conduct that are not welcome, that are personally offensive, and that affect morale, and therefore, interfere with a student's ability to study or participate in school activities. Any student, who believes she/he is being sexually harassed, should immediately report the situation to any of the following persons: counselor, teacher, nurse, principal, or assistant principal. A thorough, objective investigation will then take place. This policy includes prohibitions of sexual harassment from a staff person to a student, or a student to another student.

ZERO TOLERANCE

A positive school climate is key to preventing violence. One of our goals is to provide academic excellence in an atmosphere of Respect, Responsibility & Safety. If students, parents/guardians and staff feel a sense of community and ownership in the school, they are more likely to work with each other rather than against each other. Lessons are taught by the teachers and the guidance counselor that reinforce our mission.

PROHIBITION OF WEAPONS

The Independent School District of Boise City has "zero tolerance" for students who bring weapons or other objects/substances to school which are a threat to the health and safety of other students, staff members, or visitors, or are a disruption to the education process. Possession and/or use of these objects/substances at the elementary school or at any elementary school sponsored activity without prior permission of school officials will be brought to the attention of the building administrator immediately.

PROHIBITION OF GANGS AND HATE GROUPS

Gangs, hate groups, and similar organizations or groups which advocate hatred or discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, ancestry, national origin, or disability are inconsistent with the fundamental values of the educational environment of the Boise School District. The activities of such groups and their members are prohibited on school district property and at all school sponsored functions.

Such prohibited activities include, but are not limited to: the congregation of members, the solicitation or recruitment of members, the possession of group paraphernalia and materials, the intimidation of others, the advocacy of discrimination and any other behavior such as the wearing of gang colors or insignia and the use of language, codes and/or gestures that provoke violence or seek to advocate the purpose and objectives of such groups.
