### **ANCHORAGE STREAM ACADEMY**

#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT TO THE APC

First Quarter is coming to a close Friday. While it has been a challenging school year, we've been successful in supporting our staff and teaching our students. We're looking forward to a strong Quarter 2.

#### SCHOOL YEAR PLAN

We are continually updating the School Year Plan document to reflect our practices and response to COVID, risk models and school modes: 20-21 school year guide

Our proposal to ASD for Second Quarter is to stay in virtual/online classes for the duration of the quarter, while offering optional face to face opportunities such as outdoor learning and learning labs. This was approved by the district.

We are currently offering small, limited face to face opportunities for students who need to work in the building. Our 8th grade team is facilitating small groups (5 students max) face to face science labs in Muldoon Park for the fire project.

#### Parent Communication:

Continuing to offer "Morning Coffee" meetings each week on Wednesday. Each teacher cohort group attended on a scheduled day during first quarter to present. We will repeat this cycle 2nd quarter. APC members are invited and encouraged to attend.

**Conferences** this year will be on Thursday 10/22 from 4 to 7 PM. They will be hosted by 2nd quarter teachers as "Back to School" introductory meetings.

#### **ENROLLMENT:**

We are nearing the end of the State's official count period, with 154.25 students enrolled. On Monday we will be at 155.25, adding a new 8th grader.

**6th:** 39 male, 21 female, 60 total

**7th:** 29 male, 27 female, 56 total

**8th:** 24 male, 15 female, 39 total

## BUDGET BRIEF

**CARES Act update:** We have supply kits for each classroom with all necessary PPE and cleaning materials. We've been able to provide ample resources for staff teaching online and supplement staff for extra work with addenda from these funds as well.

**FY21:** After completion of the Count period on October 23rd, ASD will submit Average Daily Membership (ADM) to the State. FY21 funds will be adjusted based on actual ADM numbers. We should expect to see additional revenue adjusted in November.

**FY22:** We will submit a projected enrollment, receive a budget allocation and begin building our FY22 budget in November. This will need to be approved by the APC and submitted to ASD in December.

**Total unallocated reserve fund balance:** \$612,937.00

## FACILITIES:

Added two offices and a classroom on the main floor of WBU. These will become our administrative offices. We are awaiting renovation and furniture for the offices before we move. Wayland has hired Steve's replacement as building manager, Matt Parsons. Matt has been great to work with thus far.

## COUNSELING AND SEL:

Ms. Bonertz has created a Canvas page for students to access her virtual office as well as her Canvas calendar to make individual appointments. The virtual office has resources for students as well as a link to her website.

Ms. Bonertz has been checking in with students during classes to discuss current mental health, family, and academics. She is working with several at risk students in developing plans for second quarter to be more engaged and organized while we are virtual.

SEL lessons were provided to the student body during induction week to connect and engage students as well as establish routine. Ms. Bonertz will continue to work with teachers to incorporate SEL into their daily activities and identify students who may need additional one on one or group support.

How do you save something you love?: A project that takes into consideration the different perspectives in local conservation issues.

Is it feasible to walk to STREaM?: A project about the relationship between speed, distance and time.

- 8th Grade

Fire Project: Is our campus/home safe from fire danger?

Hey everybody! This quarter seems to have gone by incredibly fast as well as taken forever, but that seems to be the theme for our school year this year. Below I have some reports from teachers written in the form of blurbs to keep you updated with the happenings that are going on at Anchorage STReAM Academy. This will be my last report as Lily Goodman-Allwright has expressed interest in becoming the Staff Liaison on the APC board. She is super awesome and does a great job at the project-based learning aspect in her science class. Thank you all for your continued support as we deal with adjusting to an online setting for teaching. I have appreciated all of the kind words that have been said to me along the way. I will continue to join in APC meetings from time to time to say hello and keep in touch with everyone. But for now, here is my report:

**Mr. Bierer** - Students in math 7, PreAlgebra, and Algebra, are wrapping up the quarter with a main focus on ALEKS. This is our online curriculum with mathematics. The focus is that students become comfortable with using the online platform so that they are able to continue working on math as they move forward into quarter 2. For our (myself and Mr. Holsopple) Mission/Vision class, students are completing their presentations about the feasibility of walking to Anchorage STReAM Academy from their home. Students developed a map on Google Maps and then timed themselves walking a route to get their average walking speed. Using this data with the measured distance from their house to STReAM, students calculate the amount of time it would take them to walk. Then compile the data and present an argument to the class. In quarter 2, we are planning on repeating this project with a few extensions added on (different modes of transportation). I am planning on working with Mr. Holsopple in quarter 2 to do a cross-curricular project in Math/Science.

**Mr. Holsopple** - In Haiku form:

Quarter 1 is done!

Second quarter will be good:

Anticipation!

**Ms. Smith - 8th grade project class with Smith and Goodman:** We are wrapping up Quarter 1 aspects of the Fire Project, which is a cross-curricula fire risk assessment project. We will continue this project next Quarter; students are creating recommendations for fire safety for their homes or our school building.

**8th grade ELA with Smith:** This class supports the work of the period 1 projects class. We are ending Quarter 1 with argumentative writing to enhance fire safety recommendations.

**8th grade SS with Smith:** This class supports the work of the period 1 projects class. We are ending Quarter 1 with current event topics and summarizing informational text.

**Ms. Bonertz** - Ms. Bonertz is getting good response from students reaching out for help. She is expected to continue having individual sessions set up for students at the end of the school days. As students are coming into the building, she is also having one on one conversations with many of them to help with ongoing issues they may be having or making connections during this time. With quarter one wrapping up, she is going to be reaching out to those students who struggled more and help them develop a plan to improve next quarter.

**Ms. Staker** - Math 6 - wrapped up chapter on integers and the coordinate plane; started chapter on ratios, will continue quarter 3
