Step By Step Description	<p>Step 1: Research and Topic Selection (30 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research sustainable practices related to the 4Rs: reduce, reuse, repair, and recycle. • Select a specific topic within the 4Rs that interests you, such as reducing single-use plastics, reusing materials, repairing objects instead of discarding them, etc. <p>Step 2: Infographic Design (60 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use online graphic design tools like Canva or Piktochart to create an infographic promoting your selected 4R topic. • Organize information in a visually appealing manner, using graphics, icons, and colors to clearly and effectively convey the message. • Include practical tips and concrete examples of how to apply the 4Rs in daily life. <p>Step 3: Review and Improvement (30 minutes)</p>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review your infographic and solicit feedback from friends or family on its clarity and effectiveness. • Make necessary adjustments to improve the quality and visual impact of your design, ensuring it accurately reflects the principles of the 4Rs. <p>Step 4: Share on Social Media (30 minutes)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Publish your infographic on your personal social media accounts, highlighting the importance of sustainable practices and the 4Rs. • Encourage friends and followers to share the infographic to spread the message and motivate others to adopt more environmentally responsible habits.
Required Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Computer with internet access • Online graphic design tools (Canva, Piktochart, etc.) • Connection to social media for sharing the infographic
Activity Evaluation/Reflection	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reflect on how creating the infographic has deepened your understanding of sustainable practices and the 4Rs. • Evaluate the reception of your infographic on social media and reflect on its impact on environmental awareness in your online community. • Consider how you can continue promoting the 4Rs and sustainability through your online activity and in your daily life.
