During the 4th quarter, due to the coronavirus a few things will change. This extra syllabus was written in order to cover those changes. This is new for everyone, so please have patience as we figure things out. I, as the teacher, reserve the right to change/fix anything in this syllabus deemed necessary. If that occurs you will be alerted and the adjustments will be shown in this document.

The goal is to go slow, and only give 2 lessons per week as to not overwhelm you or myself. Video Lectures of each lesson will be posted on the class calendar found on [my class site](#). This document will be posted there too. I will try to stay at least one week ahead with lesson plans, however, understand that I have not made a video for all of these lessons and will do the best I can.

Grading:

Quizzes: Quizzes and Tests will be open book and open note but will have a time limit which will vary. 2 attempts will be given. Answers will not be provided at the end. I recommend you still watch the lecture, take notes and study like you usually would. Complete all bell ringers and homework first. That way you at least know where to find the answers should you need to look them up. Due to the time limit, you will not have sufficient time to look up every answer as you go.

Bell Ringers: Bell Ringers are to be completed same as usual. They are an open book, open note, open friend, unlimited attempt, untimed pop quiz. Make sure to watch the lecture that corresponds to the correct bell ringer first.

Notes and Homework Assignments: Guided Notes and Homework Assignments from the book will not be graded. However, it is imperative to do them in order to be successful on the Tests.

Homework Assignments from the book should be completed as usual. Answers to half the problems are in the back of your book. Use them to check your answers and know you are doing problems correctly. If questions still arise, log onto zoom during assigned time and ask for help. Questions can be emailed as well.

Notes can be used on the test. Watch lectures and take notes so you can easily find answers.

Grading Rubric:

C: In order to receive a C for the 4th Quarter. All Bell Ringers and Quizzes must be completed. Every Bell Ringer must have at least a 3 out of 5. 60% of the questions must be correct on each quiz.

B: In order to receive a B for the 4th Quarter. All Bell Ringers and Quizzes must be completed. Every Bell Ringer must have at least a 4 out of 5. 80% of the questions must be correct on each quiz.

A: In order to receive an A for the 4th Quarter. All Bell Ringers and Quizzes must be completed. Every Bell Ringer must have at least a 4.5 out of 5. 90% of the questions must be correct on each quiz.
