Pocket allows you to save web pages and access them later. Pocket even works offline!

There are 2 parts to Pocket.

- 1. The Extension -look for this at the end of the url/search bar.
- 2. The App look for this under the app launcher on your chromebook

What's the difference? The extension saves your webpage to your pocket account. The app logs you into your account.

Step 1 - sign up - Pocket will let you sign up with Google account. If you want to keep your pocket account once you graduate sign up with a personal email- it is your choice. If you sign up with your google account you have to agree to the permissions.


If you get a pop-up window about installing this on Android - you can say No Thanks at the bottom if you don't want to do this. In addition to the Android app there is also an iOS app and everything syncs if you sign in with the same email each time.





Step 2- Start Using

When you get to a website you need to save for later click on the Pocket icon



A pop-up message will appear letting you know you have been successful and suggesting you add a tag. Think of tags as folders. The website above is for the American Revolution - a useful tag is Revolution.

When you log into your account using the Pocket app you will see a list of your tags. Click on the tag to see all of the articles you have saved under that tag.
