Non-Spoiler TV Questions

I love the TV show, should I read the books?

Yes, give them a try!

I love the TV show, but I tried reading the books and didn't like them. Do I have to read them?

Of course not. The TV show stands on its own. If the books aren't to your taste, don't worry about it.

I watched the available seasons of the TV show and I want to read the books now. Can I jump in with the next corresponding book (e.g. start *Drums of Autumn* after finishing season 3) instead of starting from the beginning?

You can, but book fans don't recommend it. There is so much more plot and detail in the books (not to mention differences from the show) that you'll enjoy them more if you read them in order.

Which is better, the TV show or the books?

A question like that can't have an objective answer, so let's put it this way -- the show is a very good TV show and the books are very good books. Again, it's OK if you prefer one over the other.

Non-Spoiler Book Questions

How many books are there?

As of 2018, there are 8 books in the main series.

There are also various spin-off novel/las starring Lord John Grey and other novellas and short stories featuring supporting characters in the Outlander universe.

Is the forthcoming ninth book going to be the last in the series?

No. Author Diana Gabaldon says that there will be 10 books.

When is book 9 coming out?

Diana says that Go Tell the Bees That I Am Gone will be finished sometime in 2019.

Where do the Lord John books fit in?

The Lord John books all happen during the time period between *Dragonfly in Amber* and *Voyager*. They are all self-contained stories, so technically you don't have to read them in any order. That said, a good way to do it is to read them in the order they were published. Also, it's a good idea to read *Lord John and the Brotherhood of the Blade* and *The Scottish Prisoner* before you read *An Echo in the Bone*, since *Echo* features characters introduced/developed in those books.

In what order should I read the Lord John books and other spinoff stories? Can I read chronologically in-universe?

You CAN read them in order of the story chronology but it's best if you don't do so strictly. Scroll down to the bottom of this post for a detailed in-universe chronological order!

It's safest to read everything in the order in which it was published (see the detailed publishing order at the bottom of this post). But technically, the only books it's essential to read in order are the main series books (*Outlander*, *Dragonfly in Amber*, *Voyager*, etc.)

I've read the first 3 books in the series but am having trouble getting through books 4 and/or 5. Do I have to keep reading?

Again, you don't have to do anything you don't want to do. Some people don't like that Diana adds new POV (point-of-view, meaning chapters are told from their perspective) every book. The world of the books expands as the series goes on, and most book fans love that. If you don't, that's OK. However, it's worth noting that many people find the middle books to be more slow-going on the first read and then find that the later books end up becoming some of their favorites of the whole series.

Are there audiobooks of the series?

Yes, and they are excellent! Make sure you listen to the unabridged versions narrated by Davina Porter. Most of the novellas and Lord John novels have been made into audiobooks as well, with different narrators.

What do the various abbreviations mean?

DiA = Dragonfly in Amber

DoA = Drums of Autumn

TFC = The Fiery Cross

ABOSAA = A Breath of Snow and Ashes

ECHO = An Echo in the Bone (which can also be abbreviated as AEITB, though ECHO is easier to type)

MOBY = Written In My Own Heart's Blood. This unusual short form was invented by Diana Gabaldon while she was writing the book, where WIMOHB = MOHB = pronounced "Moh-bee" = MOBY

BJR = Black Jack Randall

LJG = Lord John Grey

- (1) Both of these stories happen before the events of OUTLANDER, but you shouldn't read them first. "Virgins" can be read any time after OUTLANDER; "All Hallows" is best read between ECHO and MOBY.
- (2) These stories are collected in a volume called Lord John and the Hand of the Devils.
- (3) "A Fugitive Green" is best read later in the series, after you've read books like The Scottish Prisoner and ECHO, which feature the characters Minnie and Hal. "Fugitive" and "Besieged" were the new stories published in the collection Seven Stones to Stand or Fall, which collects the stories not otherwise collected in Hand of the Devils.
