## The Hate U Give Research Presentation

- 1. With a partner, look up information about your topic.
- 2. Record the information in **your own words** or use quoted material. Plagiarism (accidental or intentional) is grounds for a zero with no redo.
- 3. Create a presentation with your material. You should have at least 15 slides, not counting the title or works cited slides. Your information should be **understandable**, **thorough**, **accurate**, **and as unbiased as possible**.
- 4. Cite all your sources within the presentation itself.
- 5. **Do a works cited slide** (properly formatted, not just a list of URLs). I will not require you do cite the artwork you use.
- 6. You will present in class. Make sure both you and your partner get a chance to talk. Face your audience; know your stuff; be audible; stand straight. (No gum!)

## Presentation graded on:

Mechanics (grammar, spelling, punctuation, etc.)	10 points
Coverage of topic (thorough, accurate, unbiased	
correct number of slides, knowledgeable when questioned)	20 points
Presentation (loud enough, facing audience)	10 points
Works cited (appropriate format, completeness)	5 points
Total	45 points

## Include up to 2 minutes of video for extra credit.

This is a group grade except for the presentation portion, which is individual. Choose your partner carefully.

After your presentation, you will turn in a brief (300-500 words) reflection piece on what you learned while researching your topic. Be specific; use examples.

Items to include in your research and presentation:

- 1. Background information
  - a. what happened?
  - b. where?
  - c. when?
  - d. to whom? (names/ages/injuries)
- 2. What do police say happened?
  - a. What evidence is there to support this?
- 3. What do others (witnesses, records, later investigation) say happened or may have happened?
  - a. What evidence is there to support this?
- 4. What happened immediately after?
  - a. in the case
  - b. In the community
  - c. In the country
- 5. What was the outcome at the time?
  - a. Has anything changed/happened since?
- 6. What media coverage shows the dead person in a negative light? (Include words and images.)
- 7. What media coverage shows the dead person in a positive light? (Include words and images.)
- 8. What connections do you make between the death you researched and Kahlil's (in terms of all of the above)? (Use your best *analysis*, **support your claims with evidence and reasoning**.)
