# Foundations of Literacy (F)

**ELA-03.F.08** Decode words with phoneme-grapheme correspondences:

- multisyllabic word construction and division
  - o open syllables
  - closed syllables
  - o complex closed syllables
  - long vowel VCe
  - vowel-r syllables
  - vowel team syllables
  - o consonant -le syllables
  - o syllable division principles (VC/CV, V/CV, etc.)
- inflectional endings
- Latin and Greek roots

**ELA-03.F.09** Encode words with phoneme-grapheme correspondences:

- a. vowel teams
- b. diphthongs
- c. three consonant blends
- d. other r-controlled
- e. silent letter combinations
- f. less common digraphs (e.g., ph (/f/), gh (/f/), ch (/k/ and /sh/))
- g. trigraphs
- h. schwa
- i. common derivational suffixes (e.g., -ly, -able, -ful)
- j. irregularly spelled high-frequency words

<u>**ELA.03.F.11**</u> Use new academic, content-specific, grade-level vocabulary to make connections to previously learned words and relate new words to background knowledge.

a. Make connections to a word's structure using knowledge of phonology, morphology, and word orthography to aid learning.

<u>ELA-03.F.12</u> Read accurately and automatically a variety of third-grade texts with expression, phrasing, purpose, and understanding.

<u>ELA-03.R.02</u> Ask and answer questions about key details before, during, and after reading a variety of genres, literary, and informational texts using text evidence to compare, contrast, predict, and infer.

<u>ELA-03.R.03a</u> Summarize the main idea(s) with supporting details during or after reading an informational text or passage.

ELA-03.R.03b Summarize the story by including major story elements after reading a literary text or passage.

### Writing (W)

<u>ELA-03.W.02</u> Write using an organizational structure incorporating a topic sentence, body, and a concluding statement appropriate to the task.

### Language Usage (L)

<u>ELA-03.L.01</u> Compose simple and compound declarative, interrogative, imperative, and exclamatory sentences.

- a. Begin with a capital letter and capitalize titles of respect, words in titles, and geographical names.
- b. Use periods with declarative and imperative sentences, question marks with interrogative sentences and exclamation points with exclamatory sentences.
- c. Use commas before coordinating conjunctions and to separate individual words in a series.

**ELA-03.L.02** Recognize and use parts of speech in sentences:

- a. concrete, abstract, and possessive nouns
- b. different types of verbs (i.e., action, linking, helping) and their roles in a sentence
- c. the complete subject and complete predicate of a sentence
- d. possessive adjectives
- e. prepositions
- f. coordinating conjunctions (i.e., for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so) g.-ly adverbs
