Disaster Response Personal Recommendations

From Whitney Nicole Bailey, Disaster Response Attorney:

Eastern Kentucky friends:

As a Disaster Response Attorney, I have several tips (not legal advice) to consider as we hold our breath waiting for the rain to settle, and to prepare for a potential FEMA disaster declaration.

- -Personal safety should ALWAYS be the priority over anything else. Stuff is replaceable, you are not.
- -Check on your neighbors! Especially those with small children, elderly, and those with disabilities.
- -If you live near water and are SAFELY able, consider evacuating to higher ground.
- -Also consider relocating your vehicles, recreational vehicles, trailers, lawn equipment to higher ground. Especially move uninsured/unregistered vehicles because they will not be considered for FEMA Transportation Assistance if they are damaged or destroyed.
- -Find and secure important documents like birth certificates, IDs, insurance, titles/registration, deeds, estate planning documents. Store documents inside watertight containers or Ziploc bag, if anything. Move documents to elevated surfaces or inside freezer, microwave, closed washer, top rack of a closed dishwasher.
- -DOCUMENT EVERYTHING. Take photos and videos of any property in attached garages, basements, first floors, and outside. Keep in mind that most of the outside property items or stored in unattached buildings will not be considered for FEMA Personal Property Assistance if damaged or destroyed.
- -Take photos and videos of your bridge, culvert, creek, landslide/mudslide.
- -Save photos and videos to the cloud or email to a friend for safekeeping if your phone gets damaged.
- -Document serial numbers of electronics. Move electronics to elevated surfaces.
- -Stay alert and informed, charge your phone, find batteries and flashlights.
- -If you must drive and encounter flooded roads: turn around, don't drown!!
