## **REQUIREMENTS:**

- Choir fee will cover supplies needed and field trip costs related to choir
- Specified choral uniform (see below)
- Participation in all LMEA, District 2, and Bolton Conservatory sponsored events, concerts, and contests you may qualify for
- Participation in Conservatory fundraisers

## **OBJECTIVES:**

- To build a repertoire of songs that students enjoy singing
- To provide opportunities for understanding basic music theory
- To provide opportunities for singing with proper vocal and breathing techniques
- To acquaint students with music theory, history, and proper terminology

## **CONTENT:**

- Posture sitting and standing correctly
- Breathing establish healthy and sustainable breathing habits
- Theory including staff, clef, notes/rests, pitch names of the lines and spaces, meter,, intervals, key signatures, etc.
- Articulation to obtain understandable diction
- Intonation to be aware of singing on pitch and how to harmonize in a blended fashion
- Performance using dynamics, phrasing, and all aspects of printed music to create beautiful ensemble sounds
- General Music History- to understand the importance of period pieces and how to perform them appropriately

#### **GRADING:**



- Weekly participation grades
- Weekly Binder/Journal grades
- Sight singing exercises, class exercises, and assignments
- Participation in ALL choral performances and festivals if you are absent from a concert, competition, or festival for any reason a grade of 0 will be given unless it is covered under excused absences in the RPSB handbook.

Grade Recovery per district guidelines is as follows:

- i. Only 2 grading periods can be recovered, Q4 is not included.
- ii. 67 is the maximum grade earned for GR
- iii. Student qualifications for GR
  - 1. Minimum of a 50 for the guarter recovered
  - 2. No more than 3 unexcused absences in the quarter to be recovered
- iv. Parent Contact
  - 1. Letter home on first GR
  - 2. Verbal contact on second (phone conversation with parent)

GRADING SCALE: 7 point grading scale.

## **FEES:**

# There is a \$60 choir fee required of everyone.

# This must be paid by September 14, 2023.

Fees help to pay for field trips (many of which are required for our audition and assessment schedule), District memberships, and materials needed for class.

**UNIFORM**: Due to the increasing possibility of a K-12 Academic Magnet merger, we will be shifting our uniform policy slightly. **Students may wear the same unifrom dress or tuxedo from last year, but we will be transitioning to performance black professional dress attire as we prepare for <b>this overarching transition.** The reasoning for this is to maintain uniformity throughout the Conservatory in all disciplines, the cost of uniforms being more accessible with a wider range of options, and freedom for movement in the clothes. Again, there will be **no penalty** if the student



decides to remain with their choir uniform from last year, but we will be moving to professional all black attire for 2024-2025. The rule still remains that NO HIGH HEELS are allowed. Closed toed black dress shoes are required.

\*\* We will distinguish between the middle schoolers and high schoolers with the middle school students wearing white shirts, which is why the black shirts are important.

## CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:
