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Introduction

Thank you for your interest in joining this WordPress Community team's working group, The Diverse Speaker Training Group (#WPDiversity)! Here you will find information to help you decide if you would like to join our team and help you get started.

About Us: Background, Programs, Expectations, How You Can Help

- Our post from July 2021 when we first launched the new programs and had a call-out for volunteers contains a detailed description of the work the WPDiversity working group does. Here is a brief summary of the three main components of the #WPDiversity Working group and how volunteers can help:
 - Diverse Speaker Workshops: Diverse Speaker workshops encourage and teach those from underrepresented groups (women, LGBTQIA+ individuals (which include non-binary, trans and genderqueer folk), people of color, people of different physical abilities, neurodivergent people, people who are older, etc.) how to overcome impostor syndrome and help them find topics that people want to hear at WordPress Meetups and WordCamps, as well as affirming that our community is a richer, better place when events feature a diverse speaker lineup.
 - Diverse Speaker Support: Even if one feels comfortable applying for or speaking at events, sometimes it's hard to keep track of speaking opportunities or find a supportive person to give feedback on talks. The Diverse Speaker Support program is a new Slack channel that allows for open conversation with those who have completed the Diverse Speaker Workshop as they continue on their public speaking journey.
 - Inclusion Program: The WPDiversity working group launched a new Inclusion program, created to teach, inspire, and challenge WordPress meetup and WordCamp organizers to organize diverse and inclusive

events that welcome folks from all backgrounds and experiences.

- How can you help? Our working group has all kinds of roles, from helping
 us develop the new programs to maintaining our current program.
 Workshop trainers, mentors, translations, marketing, behind-the-scenes
 admin, and more. Specific roles come up organically as we move forward,
 and you are also welcome to suggest creating a new role that inspires you
 and will assist the team in our mission. You can participate as much or as
 little as you would like.
- Meetings: We hold meetings in WordPress Slack on the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of the month at:

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<u>17:00 UTC</u> (from March 12, 2023 to November 4, 2023)
<u>18:00 UTC</u> (from November 5th 2023 to March 10, 2024)
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(Not required, but very valued)

- You're a good fit if: You have a strong desire to bring more diverse voices
 into WordPress events, and you want to help shape how that happens. You
 do not need to have any prior experience, but a willingness to share ideas,
 collaborate, and help define and tackle tasks is amazing.
- Expectations: Our working group needs volunteers to help move this
 important initiative forward. If you have signed up for something, we are
 relying on you! We understand that things do come up, so if you commit to
 a task and are unable to complete it or fulfill your role, please tell us as
 early as possible. The sooner you tell us, the easier it is to find someone to
 cover your item.
