Mrs. A. O. Foskett, 54 years, died at her home northeast Tinley Park Sunday afternoon at 1 p.m., following a ten weeks illness with heart trouble.

Mrs. Foskett nee Caroline Lund, was born in Waupaca, Wisconsin, August 14, 1879.

She was united in marriage with Mr. Foskett May 2, 1912 in Waupaca.

In March 1920 they located at Goeselville northeast of Tinley Park and has resided there ever since.

Surviving are the husband, one son Walter and one daughter Luella.

The funeral services were held on Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock at the Tinley Park M. E. church with Rev. Charles Hedler officiating. Miss Ruth Andres sang. Burial was made in the Bachelor Grove cemetery.

Mr. Foskett is a past president of the Tinley Park Lions Club and the sympathy of the community goes out to him and his family in their hour of deep sorrow.
