I disagree, I think family is as important as friends.

Family is a bit more important than friends.

My daughter is prettier than my wife.

> I agree! My son is WAY cuter than my husband.

> I agree, my nephew is prettier than my older sister.

Korean food is more delicious than Japanese food

> I disagree! I think Japanese food is more delicious than Korean food.

> I agree, Korean food is WAY/MUCH more delicious than Japanese food.
