# Salida Schools Bullying Prevention

### Overview:

Bullying is an important topic in human development. We know that humans must have healthy stress, which includes negative social interaction, to develop. Without that healthy stress humans do not develop independence and resiliency (SOURCE). However, bullying goes beyond healthy stress. Bullying is defined as unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.(SOURCE). Salida Schools follows best practices and embeds bullying reduction habits throughout the preschool through graduation continuum. Of the four research-based curriculum the Department of Education recommends, Salida Schools utilizes three. Our policy and protocols require that we engage and investigate negative interactions between peers. The final outcome that is desired, in both negative interactions and bullying scenarios, is a socially restored relationship that allows peers to operate successfully in the same social environment of school.
