**DETROIT, Lincoln** - The following is the full transcript of from nmtts' speech at a rally held in the city of Detroit in the province of Michigan.

Good evening Detroit. Thank you all for being here with me today.

I am honored to be with you here in this great and historic district, the one which gave rise to America's greatest industry, where the brands such as Ford, Chevrolet and General Motors were founded.

It was on these brands did our soldiers fight in the fields of France, the Dutch and German forests and the Austrian cities. It was because of our nation's industry, our people's innovation and entrepreneurship were we able to defeat the tyranny of facism and I come here today to ask something similar.

But first, I am also very pleased to be here in Indianapolis today, accompanied by my wife and close friend DrPukimak, who spent some time living and working with the Canadian government. Canada is an important friend and trading partner of Lincoln, with Michigan being the largest exporter to Canada out of all the provinces of our state and country. DrPukimak and I will work to foster a lasting and sound relationship with Canada.

I truly appreciate the spirit of cooperation that has been characterised by the work in which the Republican and the Civics People's Party have put into this state. Our profound dedication and commitment in winning this state transcends typical politics.

Equally important, we share a sort-of conservative philosophy. One that says that the people of Lincoln must take responsibility for their lives and actions, saying that all Great Lakers must be accountable for their behaviour, including our Governors, or soon-to-be former Governors.

Governor Cuba has used such hateful language in the press, not against me, but also to our minority communities, he's authored laws that has killed police officers, drenching himself in litres of blood. You can't enact Scandinavian or European laws in an American setting. We're different societies, we're different people. It's truly upsetting and he must be held accountable.

Not only that, our philosophy tells us we must trust local people to make decisions for their communities, this includes their schools. I fully understand that when we free people to make decisions, some may make the wrong decisions, but mistakes made closest to the people are those most easily corrected.

Our philosophy tells us that unfunded mandates at any level of government are bad public policy. It further tells us that a strong family is the backbone of a successful society. Now, these are not partisan values but common-sense values.

When a person leaves a long day of work and goes home to trouble and stress, that effect does not simply stay there. It spills over. It leaves the home and enters the public. I'm sure my Democratic colleagues will agree that they too enjoy a happy household in comparison to a broken or chaotic one.

Throughout my campaign, I have outlined three major priorities for Lincoln and will shape my legislative agenda.

First, the economy. The most important thing you and I can do to improve our economy and create jobs in Lincoln is civil justice reform. We must restore public confidence by returning fairness and balance to our legal system. Small businesses must be given an opportunity to survive, not be met with frivolous lawsuits that clog our courts, threaten

producers and delay justice for those deserving. All Great Lakers, injured or not, deserve to know our courts are a place where everyone attains equal justice under law.

Like the Reagan period, it's proven. When Democrats introduced a bill to cut taxes we had one of the strongest economic recoveries in the country because we didn't start spending and add spending without paying for them.

We'll slash any bills in which excessive spending has been going on because of Governor Cuba's delusional idea of "unlimited money" and we will continue to reject any appropriations bill that dramatically increases spending in the worst way—wasteful and corrupt ways, might I add. We'll apply these principles state-side and we'll make history by propelling this state forward in terms of job generations.

Second, the environment. We will work with farmers to boost and preserve our agricultural industry and production, increasing our exports and thus supporting our economy. I will work to preserve our great central landscapes and greenery, ensuring that through clean, green energy, we can reduce our carbon footprint and make sure our children can enjoy the beautiful outdoors.

You see, the environment is like a two-prong or three-prong spear, as I've said in many places before. It boosts the economy in different ways, agriculture, tourism. Then it reduces our carbon footprint, thus mitigating our state's contribution to global warming and finally through dams, its an investment in renewable, cleaner energy sources.

As we tackle these, a third concern is our safety and security. President Zero has halted all immigration services. Border security, checks, you name it. We have no idea what's crossing into Dixie and what's crossing in from Canada. Guns? Drugs? Human trafficking? These will simply corrupt Lincoln even more and threaten our future generation.

Governor Cuba's response? Nothing. After all, he is a man who wants to destroy American society. He's a terrorist that has permeated our government through backdoor channels. Let's close these channels to make sure Lincoln never suffers an administration so harmful like his ever again.

Moreover, if we are going to save a generation of young people, our children must know that they will face bad consequences for bad behaviour. Sadly, too many kids are not getting that message—they don't respect the law. They are joining gangs, doing hard drugs and doing all sorts of illegal activities.

Our new juvenile justice system must say to our children: We love you, but you are going to be held accountable for your actions. Discipline, strong values and strict rules go hand-in-hand with our love for our children. And make no mistake, these reforms will be designed to save children for I believe they can all be saved.

In contrast, many adult criminals are beyond rehabilitation, but that does not mean we must negate all of them. Repeat offenders, offenders that continue to offend in jail, pedophiles, child molesters—we must put a stop to the mandatory early release program that lets criminals out even though the parole board says no. Great Lakers expect responsible Lincoln officials to make these decisions and be accountable, not some mathematical formula to decide when and if a convict should be released.

Together, we can make Lincoln a bacon state. A state where our laws encourage jobs and justice, where our government frees our greatest resource—not the cars or our grain, but our people—to achieve the highest potential.

A state where all people feel safe in their communities, where children receive an excellent education so that they can excel in life and a state where each citizen accepts responsibility for his or her behaviour.

I look forward to enacting this change.
