Impact

Volunteer Attorneys from the Volunteer Lawyers Project's Tenant Assistance Project (TAP) have been extraordinarily successful in helping tenants avoid immediate eviction and homelessness. <u>In</u> **2023, TAP volunteers helped more than 1,800 families facing eviction in Douglas County.** In 98% of those cases, tenants were not immediately evicted. Of the households served, 53% were households with children.
