	Introduce the terrie Food Disnip kunch	
	Introduce the topic - Food - Picnic lunch	
	We've had breakfast with David and now we are	
	joining Elvin as he prepares for his picnic lunch.	
	Have you been on a picnic and what did you take	
	to eat? Elvin's picnic lunch is simple with foods that he likes to eat. Watch as he makes a list	
	(Auslan style, with his fingers) of the foods in his	
	sandwich. Have fun at the picnic!

	<ul> <li>Practise the food signs taught today.</li> <li>Create own picnic lunch (as per the Activity)</li> <li>Using Auslan, discuss with your partner and the class.</li> </ul>		
	Extra Activity (if time) List, using the Auslan finger method, a few foods that you do NOT like.		
5 mins	Reflection with Students: (Select from the following options)		
	<ul> <li>What things did you place in your picnic basket? Explain using Auslan.</li> <li>Did you understand what your partner chose for their picnic lunch?</li> <li>Did some students like unusual things?</li> <li>Did you watch how Elvin made a 'list' of foods in the sandwich, using his fingers? This is used frequently when you have a number of things to sign about.</li> <li>Were you able to make a list (Auslan style) of foods you did not like?</li> <li>At home you could practise making a list of the foods in your meals.</li> </ul>
