# Course Description

Students taking this course will gain knowledge and experience in one or more of the following areas; Audio, Video, Graphic and Photographic Arts. They will be trained utilizing state of the art equipment and industry standard programs with high standards and focus in visual communications. Students will learn the art of storytelling in many forms of media with a main focus in Video Production and film. This course will include a critical analysis of media arts in various contexts including aesthetic, ethical, social and professional considerations for the media artists. Anyone interested in a career in Visual Arts is encouraged to take this course. Students will also be required to begin a digital portfolio where they will collect, select and reflect on all learning experiences.
