GROUP A – Club World Cup 2025 Preview

1. FC Porto — Likely Group Winner

Why?

- **Squad Quality & Depth:**
Highest market value (€312.7M) and 14 international players. A balanced squad with high performers like Samu Aghehowa (19 goals) and multiple playmakers across midfield and full-backs.
- **Form & Competition Level:**

2. Flamengo — South American Giants with Grit

Second appearance. Were runners-up in the 2023 CCL but **failed to qualify in 2024**. Unlikely to challenge consistently at CWC level with current squad dynamics.
