Its architectural grandeur reflects the rich cultural heritage of South India.

### Main Attractions / Things to See

The Srikalahasti Temple complex offers several captivating sights:

- Vayu Linga: The presiding deity, Lord Srikalahasteeswara, is worshipped in the
  form of a Vayu Linga, representing the element of wind. Devotees can observe the
  flame flickering even without any direct air circulation, a mystical phenomenon
  attributed to the presence of Vayu.
- **Gopurams**: The temple boasts magnificent gopurams (entrance towers) adorned with intricate carvings and sculptures, depicting various mythological scenes. The main gopuram, built by Krishnadevaraya, is particularly impressive.
- **Hundred-Pillared Mandapam**: This architectural marvel features intricately carved pillars, each telling a story from Hindu mythology.
- Pathala Ganapathi: A shrine dedicated to Lord Ganesha, located underground, which requires descending a flight of steps.
- Kannappa Temple: A small shrine dedicated to the ardent devotee, Kannappa.

#### **Best Time to Visit**

The best time to visit Srikalahasti Temple is during the cooler months, from **October to March**. The weather during this period is pleasant, making it comfortable for sightseeing and performing rituals. Avoid visiting during the summer months (April to June) when temperatures can be very high.

# **Entry Details**

- **Temple Timings**: The temple is generally open from **6:00 AM to 9:00 PM** every day. However, timings may vary during special occasions and festivals.
- **Entry Fee**: There is no entry fee for general darshan. However, special darshan tickets and tickets for specific pujas are available for a fee.
- **Pooja Tickets**: Tickets for Rahu-Ketu Sarpa Dosha Nivarana Puja and other special rituals can be purchased at the temple counter.

- Darshan: Participate in the general darshan or opt for special darshan for a quicker viewing of the deity.
- Rahu-Ketu Sarpa Dosha Nivarana Puja: Many devotees visit the temple specifically to perform this puja to alleviate astrological afflictions.
- **Abhishekam**: Witness or participate in the various abhishekam ceremonies performed for Lord Shiva.

• **Temple Exploration**: Take time to admire the intricate carvings, sculptures, and architectural grandeur of the temple complex.
