Point of View

- 1 Point of view refers to how a person or character looks at, or views, an object or a situation in a story.
2. The character in a story may view objects from perspectives that are different from your own. It is important to understand the actions of characters to appreciate the plot of a story. It is also important to understand characters' differing points of view.
3. Watch or read the story [Two Bad Ants](#).
 - How do the text and illustrations show objects from an ant's point of view?
 - How is an ant's point of view different from a person's point of view?
 - Do objects look big or small to an ant?
 - What might your shoe look like to an ant?
 - What might your classroom look like to an ant?
4. Think of everyday items that ants see one way and people see another. On the [Point of View Chart](#), record your ideas. For example, under a "person's Point of View", you may write "grass" and under the "Ant's Point of View" you may write forest.
5. After completing the chart. Rewatch or reread the story.
 - Has your understanding of point of view improved?
 - What aspects of point of view do you understand better?

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
