Introduction

Background behind your proposition: a real-life problem, motivation and positive outcomes or risks your idea addresses.

Describe the formulation of your research problem: how it connects with the real-life problem and what you focus on (decisions). Also, describe your assumptions considered in your framing of the problem and the scope of your research in relation to the background.

Illustrate the objectives of your study and connect them to the methodology.

Address the relevance of your contribution to the Text Affects community.

Literature review (Related Works / State of the Art / Background)
Discuss here all and only references relevant to your work.

Methods (including Limitations)

Describe your research strategy. Diagrams could be useful if the design is articulated.

Results

In this section, you can present collected data or any form of structured analysis.

Discussion

It should include a discussion of the problem and objectives. For instance, if you defined explicit research questions in the introduction, you should address them explicitly in the discussion.

Furthermore, a complete study may be expected to have an impact strategy and/or early evidence of impact. If so, in the discussion, you should address how your work leads to impact. I

Conclusions

Report on lessons learned and recommendations about future research directions.

References

Comprehensive citation of sources and materials used. References should be limited to content cited in your draft.

Acknowledgements

Acknowledgements for collaborations and minor contributions.

Reference to projects funding your research.
