*Keep in mind that assembling a French infantry kit requires time and patience. It can take months to complete a basic French infantry field kit at a cost of around \$2,000-3,000. The question above is primarily meant to gauge your anticipation of how long you believe it will take you to assemble the kit given costs outlined below.

With that said, please know that many loaner uniform and equipment items can be made available to new members as they work to assemble their kits. The expectation is for new members to have a complete basic kit of their own in about a year's time and a full kit shortly thereafter.

The basic field kit consists of the following items (prices are estimated):

- Greatcoat - \$600-800
- Trousers - \$250-300
- Boots - \$185
- Leg wraps - \$30
- Helmet - \$50-150
- Cap - \$40
- Gas mask - \$75-150
- Canteen - \$75-100
- Haversacks (2) - \$40 each
- Underclothes (shirt, drawers, neck tie, flannel belt) - \$150
- Leather accoutrements (belt, cartridge pouches, bayonet frog, suspenders) - \$200
- Rifle (Lebel M1886/93) - \$1,000
