Stage 1: Desired Results	
<p>General Information</p> <p>This unit explores how Christ performed miracles and ministered to us while He was on Earth. We also learn that Christ left us the seven sacraments to continue to minister to us, heal us and help us live our Christian faith more fully. Sacred Scripture

Sacraments

Standard 3: SACRAMENTS: Understand and participate in the sacraments of the Church as efficacious signs of God's grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church.

5.03.01 Explain how God shares his grace with us through the seven sacraments.

5.03.02 Identify that the sacraments are special signs and instruments of God's love and presence with us.

5.03.03 Identify the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

5.03.04 Define and explain the two sacraments of healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick.

5.03.05 Recall that Penance, Reconciliation, and Confession are three names for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

5.03.06 Define and explain the two Sacraments of Service: Holy Orders and Matrimony.

5.03.07 Demonstrate how the symbols and symbolic actions of each sacrament represent God's presence in a special way, i.e. Gifts of the Holy Spirit, etc.

5.03.08 Describes the sacraments as supernatural signs of grace instituted by Christ and given to the Church to strengthen our faith and make us holy.
