

1. Controversial statements / myths

In this activity, you will have to read different statements and tell us if you agree or disagree. Justify your opinion.

1. You can learn English well without speaking.
2. Grammar is the most important part of learning a language.
3. Adults learn languages more slowly than children.
4. Watching series in English is enough to become fluent.
5. It is better to study a little every day than many hours once a week.
6. Making mistakes is a bad thing when learning a language.
7. You need to live in an English-speaking country to learn English well

2. Tasks to rank (easiest → most difficult)

In this activity, you will have to read different statements about foreign language learning and rank them from easiest to most difficult.

1. Understand the main idea of a short video
2. Write a short email (80–100 words)
3. Have a 5-minute conversation with a native speaker
4. Understand a song in English
5. Read and understand a short news article
6. Speak in front of a group for 2 minutes
7. Understand a fast conversation between two native speakers

3.Common problems + giving advice

A friend of yours is trying to improve English but he/she is having lots of problems. Give him a piece of advice for each of his/her problems. (*Use: should / shouldn't*)

1. "I try to watch movies in English, but I don't understand and I get frustrated."
2. "I forget new vocabulary very quickly."
3. "I understand English, but I can't speak."
4. "I feel nervous when I speak English in class."
5. "I don't have time to study English during the week."
6. "I translate everything from my language to English."
7. "I stop studying because I don't see progress."
