The program includes training for youth in several areas such as Carpentry, Culinary, Automotive Tech, Advanced Manufacturing, CNA, Homeland Security, Information Technology, Masonry, and more. Job Corps is a free program for youth ages 16-24. Participants in the program can either commute or

live on campus, they are paid during their time in the program, and they can get assistance in getting their driver's license and with job placement following completion of the program.

AmeriCorps & FEMACorps

AmeriCorps and FEMACorps are programs that provide volunteer experience. The program is for youth ages 18-24 years old and includes a modest stipend and provides for a participant's room and board. The service work is 10 months in duration and can be in a variety of areas, such as: fighting poverty, teaching kids to read, supporting veterans, cleaning up parks, trails, and shorelines, and building homes for the homeless.
