Online Encyclopedias and Dictionaries

It is typical for encyclopedias and dictionaries not to provide the authors' names. Therefore, we treat online encyclopedia entries similar to websites that do not provide an author's name; we move the entry name to the front of the citation and provide publication dates if present (or specify "(n.d.)" if no date is present in the entry).

- *Center the title "References" at the top of the page
- *Indent every line, other than the first line, for each entry (using the Tab key or 5 spaces, or using left tab margins).
- *Do not leave a space between entries (this is why we indent, to signal the a new citation)
- *Double space your references list (just as you do your essay)
- *Arrange your references in alphabetical order by the author's last name.
