**Long Term Campaign/Work:** Work to get Mayor Gimenez to host a community engagement initiative with local organizations, including a series of community dialogue events, to consider the energy needs of residents, workers, and communities; explore pathways; and garner recommendations for the City of Miami to transition to 100% clean, renewable energy rooted in racial and economic justice.

## **MICHIGAN:**

### **Flint, MI on 9/8 @ 8:00am and @ 6:00pm EST**

**Leads:** MI PCM Table

**Partners:** Ecology Center, Souladarity, Good Jobs Now Detroit, NAACP, MI EJ Coalition, BGA

**What:** Statewide Environmental and Climate Justice Summit and Cultural Event (with music voter registration, and voter pledge call to action): The event will take a deep dive into the collective strategies that communities can take to begin addressing local issues. The day-long summit which begins at 8:00AM will be immediately followed by a large movement-building cultural event at 6:00PM that will be open to the public and will feature music by local musicians, partner-led cultural activities, voter registration, and a voter pledge call to action.

**Elected Official Engagement:** N/A

**Demands:** Just Transition Away from Fossil Fuels

**Long Term Campaign/Work:** Build a well-trained activist base within the climate and environmental justice community that can continue to engage people through 2019 and 2020.

## **ILLINOIS:**

### **Downstate: Carbondale/Champaign/Peoria/Galena/Mattoon/Springfield on 9/7 and 9/8 @ 11:00am CST**

**Leads/Partners:** Prairie River Network, Sierra Club, United Congregations of Metro East, Women for Change, Audubon Society, Solar by Jos., Ride the Rails, and Galena Green Team

**What:** Various downstate events in the form of rallies, marches, voter forums, and movie screenings will be taking place throughout the down state and northwest illinois regions to engage local residents around climate action.

**Turn-Out:** 100-300 per event

**Elected Official Engagement:** Local elected officials from Joliet and Elwood

**Demands:** Cleanup of superfund site; just transition/clean jobs; regulation of coal ash; shutting down power plant

**Long-term Campaign Work:** A number of these groups are already working together in partnership of the above issues and will use September 8th as an opportunity to engage more people and build capacity to pivot to build power to tackle those issues.

### **Elwood/Joliet/Chicagoland on 9/8 @ 1:00pm CST**

**Leads/Partners:** SEIU Local 1, Little Village

**What:** Press Conference, March, and Rally: A 10:00am CST press conference in Chicago will be followed by a march to the warehouse hub in the south suburb. At 1:00pm CST, partners from throughout the region will hold a rally targeting warehouse owners and local elected officials, highlighting issues related to the area's temporary low-wage jobs, diesel truck emissions, and nearby detention center.

**Turn-Out:** 3,000 to 5,000 (statewide)

**Elected Official Engagement:** TBD

**Demands:** Improve Warehouse Working Conditions, Pollution, and Low Wage Jobs in Will County

**Long-term Campaign/Work:** Following 9/8, there will be an organizing pivot to hold local Will County elected officials accountable for the incentives/trade-offs they made by letting these warehouses come here in exchange for benefits that never materialized. The event will lay the foundation for a local minimum wage push, requirements for new warehouse buildings to be sustainably built, and more.

## **MINNESOTA:**

### **Minneapolis, MN on 9/8 @ 12pm CST**

**Leads:** PCM MN Table

**Partners:** MN350, SEIU, BGA, Black Visions Collective, Take Action

**What:** Echo Event and Rally: This event will include action-oriented workshops facilitated by partner organizations, a panel of youth climate activists, and a large community art build. The event will be followed by a rally/call to action in which attendees will be asked to pledge to vote as well as sign on to a petition asking the governor to commit to meaningful climate action.

**Turn Out:** 300

**Elected Official Engagement:** Governor Dayton

**Demands:** A Citizen Petition Process Requiring Carbon Emissions/Greenhouse Gas Emission Regulation Via the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency

**Long Term Campaign/Work:** 1) Working to build a multi-sectoral climate, jobs, and justice table to advance a strong climate/emissions reduction practice and policy and 2) Using Sept 8th as a launching point, the BlackVisions Collective (Minneapolis BLM Chapter) will begin convening people of color-led organizations from around the metro area to address environmental and climate justice locally (this would be the first coalition of its kind to focus on climate issues impacting communities of color).

**What:** Multi-Sector Climate Summit: Union, faith, community, youth, and environmental groups from around the state will come together for a summit consisting of various workshops led by local partners and will include a keynote speaker, storytelling component, and a call to action asking participants to sign up and pledge to vote for climate, jobs, and justice

**Turn Out:** 1,000

**Elected Official Engagement:** NA

**Demands:** A Just Transition and Environmental and Climate Justice

**Long Term Campaign/Work:** The work includes a just transition study that, complementing the Summit, will have the economic analysis to be the backbone for legislation or a ballot initiative to reduce carbon emissions while ensuring a just and equitable transition for fossil fuel dependent workers.

**PCM Distributed Events:** PCM Distributed Events vary in type and size but all lift up the success of local climate leadership and collaboration, feature engaged targets and/or specific demands, and tell a compelling movement-building story that connects the 9/8 mobilization to GCAS, the midterms, and beyond.
