 - Texas Department of Health and Human Services announced the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Medicaid benefits will automatically be renewed so existing clients can maintain uninterrupted coverage during the COVID-19 public health crisis. This means people who have Medicaid can keep their Medicaid without signing up to renew.
 - Texas is also waiving interview requirements for households applying for SNAP. Households are not required to complete an interview before approval if identity has been verified and mandatory verification steps are completed. Members will be notified when it is time to renew again. Texans in need can apply for benefits, including SNAP and Medicaid, at <u>YourTexasBenefits.com</u> or use the Your Texas Benefits mobile app to manage benefits.
