What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information **for student education and welfare**:

- Names and contact details for students/children
- Gender
- Pronoun preferences
- Date of birth
- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) or additional support information (includes reasonable adjustments and special educational needs and disabilities)
- Welfare information (includes family and home life circumstances and history)
- Attendance and reason for absence data

- Exam results and qualifications
- Progress reports
- Information relating to compliments and complaints
- Exclusion, suspension and behavioural information

We also collect or use the following information **for student education and welfare**:

- Racial or ethnic origin
- Health information

We collect or use the following information **for recruitment purposes**:

- Contact details (eg name, address, telephone number or personal email address)
- Date of birth
- National Insurance number
- Employment history (eg job application, employment references or secondary employment)
- Education history (eg qualifications)
- Right to work information

We also collect or use the following information **for recruitment purposes**:

- Racial or ethnic origin

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a “lawful basis” for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO’s website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- **Your right of access** - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with.
