Superintendent Dr. Rich Drolet would like to share an update regarding the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's (DESE) mask mandate for the current school year.

On Monday, Sept. 27, after consulting with medical experts and state health officials, DESE Commissioner Jeffrey Riley announced that the state will extend the school mask mandate through **at least Nov**. 1. The previous mask mandate, issued Aug. 25, had put into place a mask mandate until Oct. 1.

Under the state's mask mandate, all K-12 students, educators and staff are required to wear a mask while in schools through Nov. 1 to continue to ensure the health and safety of students and staff, and to provide time for more students and educators to get vaccinated. School visitors will also continue to be required to wear masks during this time.

With the updated mandate, if a school demonstrates a vaccination rate of 80% or more of all students and staff by Oct. 15, then vaccinated individuals in that school would no longer be subject to the mask requirement. In alignment with

statewide guidance, unvaccinated students and staff would be required to continue wearing masks.

Whether or not a school or district fulfills the 80% vaccination designation, it is a local decision to be made by school and district leaders in consultation with local health officials.

According to DESE, masks may be removed indoors or other mitigation strategies may be put into place when necessary for students to participate in elective classes, such as band. Additionally, masks are required for any sports-related activity for student-athletes and coaches when indoors, in alignment with guidance provided by the Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association (MIAA).

Parents and guardians should note that separate from DESE's mask mandate, under the Department of Public Health's mask advisory, students riding any district bus or visiting any of the district's health offices must continue to wear masks at all times while in these settings.



Reminder: Please remember to label any personal items that come to school including, but not limited to: water bottles, lunchboxes, book bags and coats. When these items are labeled, it is much easier for us to identify the owner of the item. Thank you!



Our CIA's or Curriculum Instructional and Assessment Leaders at Aitken, continue to meet on an on-going basis to discuss potential learning loss due to the pandemic. Discussions center around how to best support students and how to help reduce learning gaps.

HEALTH SCREENINGS

Health Screenings will begin in November and continue throughout the school year. In order to ensure the student's privacy, the results will not be disclosed to the student. You will be notified in writing if there are any problems or concerns.

If you would like your child to opt out of the screenings, please inform me in writing (a note or email to devanej@seekonkschools.org) by Friday, October 29th.

As mandated by Massachusetts state law, the following screenings will be conducted;

Vision and hearing will be done in all grades K-5 Height, weight, and BMI for grades 1 and 4 Postural (aka scoliosis) screening for students in grade 5

Daily COVID-19 Symptom Checklist

Please monitor your child <u>daily</u> for the following symptoms:

COVID-19 symptoms list:

- Fever (100.0° Fahrenheit or higher), chills, or shaking chills
- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- New loss of taste or smell
- Muscle aches or body aches
- Cough (not due to other known cause, such as chronic cough)
- Sore throat, when in combination with other symptoms
- Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea when in combination with other symptoms
- Headache when in combination with other symptoms
- Fatigue, when in combination with other symptoms
- Nasal congestion or runny nose (not due to other known causes, such as allergies) <u>when in combination with other symptoms</u>

If your child is experiencing any of these symptoms, please <u>do not</u> send them to school and contact their Primary Care Physician.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Unvaccinated individuals <u>AND</u> any close contacts presenting with these symptoms should follow <u>testing and quarantine</u> response protocols.
- Vaccinated individuals who are not close contacts should follow the testing and
 quarantine response protocols if they are experiencing symptoms in <u>bold</u>. These
 individuals may also seek clinical guidance to assess the need for PCR testing if they
 have other symptoms on this list.


