Nobody warned the education system that he was coming.

J. Cornelius George is a fourth-generation educator, standup comedian, improv performer, radio personality, and doctoral candidate — and he will be the first to tell you those are not separate jobs. They never were. He teaches how he lives: with humor, without apology, and with the belief that the punchline and the lesson are the same thing.

He is the founder of Laugh Your Class Off, LLC — an applied humor and improvisational learning institute that has been changing what PD days feel like in schools across Georgia and beyond. Not a pep rally. Not a keynote with slides full of clipart. Those are easy. What Cornelius built is a full professional development system running on the same mechanics as a great comedy set: setup, picture, reveal. The aha moment and the punchline are structurally identical. He proved it. Then he built a company around it.

On stage, Cornelius is a regular host at the world-famous Uptown Comedy Corner, where he leads a monthly show dedicated to educators. He co-hosts the Kiss Radio Show on FUBU Radio, bringing cultural commentary and unfiltered conversation to a global audience. He has shared stages with George Wallace, J. Anthony Brown, Griff, Lavar Walker, and countless other national and international touring comedians — and held his own every time. That is not a claim. That is a track record.

The credentials? He has them. Two-time PBIS Film of the Year recipient (2019 & 2020) from the Association of Positive Behavior Support for his anti-bullying and teen suicide

prevention films. 2025 Trailblazing Educator. 2015 Celebrity Educators Award. Featured on WSB-TV. Ed.S. in Special Education. Twenty-plus years in classrooms with real kids, real stakes, and real results — and he still shows up. That either makes him dedicated or deeply confused. He prefers dedicated. Is it bragging if it's true?

But here is what the résumé does not capture: the student everybody else sent to the office who became the anchor of his improv unit. The teacher who walked into PD skeptical and left renewed — not inspired, renewed. The room full of people who came expecting another boring session and left feeling like something had been unlocked.

He carries four generations of educators into every room he walks into. He buries the real thing in the joke. And when the picture lands — and it always lands — the room gets both the laugh and the lesson at the same time.

Anybody can make a room laugh. He makes a room learn while they're too busy laughing to notice. The joke was always the lesson. It just took a comedian with a doctorate to prove it.
