Sample Size: 725 likely voters

Margin of Error: $\pm 3.6\%$ at a 95% confidence level

1. Introduction

This national survey was conducted among **725** likely voters with a margin of error **$\pm 3.38\%$** at a **95%** confidence level. The data was weighted based on voter demographics, including gender, age, race/ethnicity, education, partisan identity and turnout patterns. The survey was administered using online panels to ensure a representative sample of the national electorate.

2. Methodology

All participants in the survey were first screened based on their age and self-reported voter registration status. Respondents under 18 or not registered to vote in the United States were excluded. Additionally, respondents were asked a series of likely voter questions—such as their past voting behavior and likelihood of voting in upcoming elections—to identify those most likely to vote. Only respondents meeting the criteria for likely voters were included in the final analysis. The survey was conducted in English only.

The dataset was weighted to reflect national Census data, ensuring that the sample aligned with the registered voter population in terms of race/ethnicity, education levels, gender, and age distributions. This approach ensured that the demographic composition of the sample reflected that of the electorate.

To further refine the sample, L2 voter file data was utilized for validation. The voter file data allowed us to adjust turnout models based on real-world voter history, ensuring key demographic groups such as age, gender, and party affiliation were proportionally represented. Regression analysis and historical turnout data from the 2016 and 2020 general elections were employed to model expected voter turnout and demographic trends, including voting methods (mail-in, early, or in-person).

Additionally, the sample was refined to account for regional voting variations using sources like the MIT Election Data + Science Lab, allowing for local turnout adjustments. This methodology combined demographic weighting, voter screening, and cross-validation with external voter data to ensure that our sample accurately reflects the likely electorate, while maintaining the transparency expected of non-probability sampling.

Electorate Breakdown from Weighted Results

- Partisan ID: Democrat 36% Republican 35%, Independent 29%
- Gender: Female 51%, Male 49%
- Age: 18-29 15%, 30-44 24%, 45-64 37%, 65+ 24%
- Race: White 70%, Black 19%, Hispanic 5% Other 6%
- Education: Non-college 57%, College 43%
