LAUSD Board Recognizes Diwali throughout Los Angeles Schools

Los Angeles (November 14, 2023) - A resolution sponsored by Board Vice President Scott M. Schmerelson, co-sponsored by Board Members Melvoin, Goldberg, Ortiz-Franklin, and Gonez, and passed unanimously, was approved today, officially recognizing Diwali in the Los Angeles Unified School District for the first time.

The resolution recognizes the contributions of the South Asian community to California and the Los Angeles region while asking the superintendent to incorporate age-appropriate discussions and practices about South Asian heritage into the district curriculum.

“I am proud to have worked with the South Asian community around Los Angeles to bring forth this resolution,” said Board Vice President Scott M. Schmerelson. “This ensures the district stays ahead of the curve in recognizing Diwali, our South Asian Community, and the more than one billion people who observe this essential holiday.”
