**WHY:** The PreACT 9 Secure provides valuable insights into predicted performance on the ACT which you will take as a Junior and/or Senior in high school. The results can be used to help you plan your coursework, explore different academic paths, and make informed decisions about your future goals.

**WHEN:** On **Wednesday, April 15th**, all 9th-grade students are scheduled to take the PreACT 9 Secure. The school day begins at **7:15 a.m.** and buses depart at approximately **12:00 p.m.**

**WHAT:** The **PreACT 9 Secure** consists of the following test sections:

- English: 44 questions, 35 minutes
- Math: 34 questions, 45 minutes
- 15 minute break
- Reading: 33 questions, 40 minutes
- Science: 32 questions, 35 minutes
- SchoolLinks Activity

**TRANSPORTATION:**

Buses will run their normal routes in the morning. **Standard time testing will conclude around 11:45 a.m.** Buses will depart at 12:00 p.m. There will be a second bus run that departs at 12:45 p.m. for extended time students.

**TEST PREPARATION:**

- Students will have the opportunity to complete a tutorial of the **TestNav** application used to administer the PreACT 9 Secure exam. TestNav also has an optional practice test built into the application. This tutorial session will be completed through your English class sometime before the Spring Break.

- Snacks/drinks for break time are optional; these items must remain under the desk during testing.

- Any other non test-related materials, including fidgets and/or sensory tools (ex: Needoh)

**ELECTRONIC DEVICES:**

- Cell phones, smartwatches, and any other device that can connect to the internet cannot be accessed during testing and/or break times.
- If you bring one of these devices to your test room, it will be collected by your proctor.
