

Crochet Bow Headband



chain 6.

row 1: double crochet in the 4th stitch. double crochet 2 more time for 3 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 2: double crochet in the first stitch, and increase in the first stitch. double crochet until the last stitch and increase in the last stitch as well. you should have 5 double crochets now. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 3: double crochet in the first stitch, and increase in the first stitch. double crochet until the last stitch and increase in the last stitch as well. you should have 7 double crochets now. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 5: double crochet in the first stitch, and increase in the first stitch. double crochet until the last stitch and increase in the last stitch as well. you should have 9 double crochets now. chain 3 and turn your work.


row 6: double crochet in the first stitch, and increase in the first stitch. double crochet until the last stitch and increase in the last stitch as well. you should have 11 double crochets now. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 7: double crochet in the first stitch, and increase in the first stitch. double crochet until the last stitch and increase in the last stitch as well. you should have 13 double crochets now. chain 1 and turn your work.



row 8-19

you will now single crochet, following this color chart

this is how it should look after one repeat of the color chart. you should repeat this 2 times total for this side.



this is how it should look when you are halfway done.

we will now reflect the opposite of this, and you will start at the top row of the color chart and crochet to the bottom row. this will include the 4 blank rows at the top of the chart, so you will have 8 blank single crochet rows total between these 2 bows.



row 1: chain 3. double crochet in every single crochet stitch, you should have 13 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 2: decrease in the first 2 stitches, then double crochet until the second to last stitch. decrease in the last 2 stitches, you should have 11 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 3: decrease in the first 2 stitches, then double crochet until the second to last stitch. decrease in the last 2 stitches, you should have 9 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 4: decrease in the first 2 stitches, then double crochet until the second to last stitch. decrease in the last 2 stitches, you should have 7 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 5: decrease in the first 2 stitches, then double crochet until the second to last stitch. decrease in the last 2 stitches, you should have 5 double crochets. chain 3 and turn your work.

row 6: decrease in the first 2 stitches, then double crochet until the second to last stitch. decrease in the last 2 stitches, you should have 3 double crochets.



from this point, slip stitch a border until you get to the single crochet section. here, single crochet a border until you get to the double crochet section again, then slip stitch into the border of the double crochet section until you get to the next pointy end.



at the pointy end, pick up 3 stitches on your hook and begin an i-cord.



I did 30 rows for my i-cord.

make a slip knot on your hook and insert your hook into the base of your i-cord.

slip stitch along the border of the double crochet section, then single crochet along the border of the single crochet section. when you get to the double crochet section again, slip stitch in the border until you get to the point.

here, pick up the 3 double crochet stitches on your hook again and begin an i-cord of the same length.



sew in your tailends, and you should be done!
