Do not miss out on the joy and excitement on the face of your kid after tracing the first print of their hand. You can also ask them to apply the paint on your hand as well and make traces on your hand as well. Forget about the mess on the floor and how dirty their clothes get after finishing.

Let your child use any color they want and make as many prints as they want on a piece of paper. Once they are finished, ask them to tell you about their favorite print. What color did they use? What did they like most about making the print?

Clay Art
