Who - French and Native Americans vs. the British and Colonists.

When - 1754 - 1763.

Where - New England and southeastern part of Canada.

Why - the British wanted land from the French and the Native Americans.

What happened - the British won the war but the French also won because they received sugar islands.

Stamp Act

- After winning the French-Indian War in 1763, the British were in a lot of debt.
- They decided to raise money by taxing American colonists.
- Proclamation of 1763 colonists can't move into the land won in the war it's Native American land already promised to Native Americans
- Stamp Act passed by the British government March 1765
- Stamp Act went into effect November 1, 1765
- Stamp Act placed a small tax on all newspapers and other printed materials
