The problem we want to solve

We have worked on making the supply chain of energy more transparency online, trivial to check. We now want to bring this kind of transparency and ease of use to sustainability and general corporate responsibility.

We want to make it easier for a motivated and interested person to understand an organisations activity, and what evidence exists about them before:

- a) Buying their products services
- b) Including them in their supply chain
- c) Taking up a job with them
- d) Writing policy

The approach - (from the point of view of the the green web fdn)

Make it easier to go from a domain (i.e. a website) to find as much information as possible in the public domain, and in a way that supports meaningful comparisons amongst its peers. Make it easier to access to relevant sustainability performance information, for free, to expand the public discourse.

One scenario:

Someone goes to zalando.com / zalando.de / zalando.se - they are able to jump from there quickly to see an independent review of the claims made about the organisation, so they can make more informed decisions.

(two example might be either checking the web address against the green web checker, or have a check run in-browser automatically, to provide links for further investigation)

They have a clear way to see further information about that company's record, in a form where it is able to contribute to a conversation, but is not able to entirely control the message.

This means making it possible to surface some information on the checking screen, but also being able to delve more deeply.

How might this work for a brand?

The dream: we go from a domain name, to the huggable entity or general idea of a company/org, to detailed info:

Zara -> Inditex > WikiRate / Open Corporates

For this to work, the Green Web Foundation would need to be able to link the domain zara.com to the corporate grouping **inditex**.

There are two ways to do this:

Manually linking to the wikipedia page or open corporates:

We could simply build a link to open corporates or wikipedia in the form people use when listing information about their company to get a green badge.

They might link to this

Probably hard to build the UI to encourage this.

via corporate entities listed on open corporates

If any of zara or inditex's legal identifiers are listed under the entry for opencorporates, then getting folks to share a company identifier for zara in return for their green badge maybe enough to establish the link

zara.com -> provided legal identifier for zara from green web fdn -> match under opencorporate grouping
for inditex -> wikirate info

This might be simpler. Many brands and companies are already listed under the corporate grouping. If a matching identifier is in that grouping (which is user generated info) then you can establish the link

- Human friendly name on wikirate

A little complexity

Really though, it's made up of two organisations - Mozilla Foundation (MoFo), which owns Mozilla Corporation (MoCo):

When a browser was on <https://mozilla.org>, we'd want to be able to present information we have about Mozilla, like the link to their own CSR reports, any information we can find on wikirate.

Do do this we need to be able to establish a link between <https://mozilla.org> (the url we get sent, or have checked against our API) to https://wikirate.org/Mozilla_Corporation, and be able to look up whatever info we have about Mozilla.

If we have Mozilla's public IP ranges, we can point to a organiastion in our own green web database of providers. Alternatively, we would need a way to link the domain mozilla.org to the provider. This is pretty much what our greendomains table does though - it links domains to companies.

This what we'd figure out how to build and spec out. Once we have established a way to link domains to companies, then we can show information in browser extensions or own pages.

How do I go from a metric to the company?

I need to pass in the name, like so Chevron Corporation. The example below links to all the reported scope 3 emissions for Chevron:

How do I go from a wikipedia name to a wikirate company?

The listings of companies contain the wikipedia link. We can get a list of companies from the API

How do I go from a legal identifier to a wikirate company?

It looks like we'll need to maintain a lookup table, as there isn't a single API call we can make to get back a company if we only have the legal identifier or the wikipedia name.

It's simple enough to maintain a local lookup table though in this case
