Library






The Carnegie shortlisted books have arrived!

Maths assessments

Further maths and preparation for A-level

Bridging the gap classes have now been running for 4 weeks. Students have looked at transformations of graphs, the equation of a circle, algebraic fractions and vectors. Students are no longer being offered the option of doing a Further Maths GCSE qualification; instead students will learn some A-level content in these sessions to prepare them for the transition.
