

Pass/Fail Policy for FRH courses at Wake Forest

TO THE STUDENT:

To register for a FRH course on a pass/fail basis, you must complete this document and meet with your professor **before receiving his or her signature on the registrar's form**. Please read this document carefully, fill out the information below, and return it to your professor, who will make a copy for you and keep the original on file. **Please note that requests to change grade mode are made through Workday. The deadline to change from grade mode to pass / fail is the drop date (Fall 25: September 29; Spring 26: February 17)**

As stated in the WFU undergraduate bulletin, students in their second, third, and fourth years may choose the option, under certain conditions, of registering for courses on a pass/fail basis. Courses used to fulfill undergraduate requirements – including the basic requirement in a foreign language and all courses that count towards the major/minor – may not be taken on a pass/fail basis unless they are offered only on that basis. Students therefore may not take the 200-level FRH course on a pass/fail basis if they are using it to fulfill the WFU basic requirement in a foreign language. (See the bulletin for the College's complete pass/fail policy.)

The French faculty permit students to take some non-required courses on a pass/fail basis under certain conditions. In particular, students who elect to take a course at the 100-level (111, 112, 113, 153, 154) on a pass/fail basis should recognize the importance of these courses as building blocks for future success in FRH 212/213.

The Pass/Fail policy for all courses in French follows.
